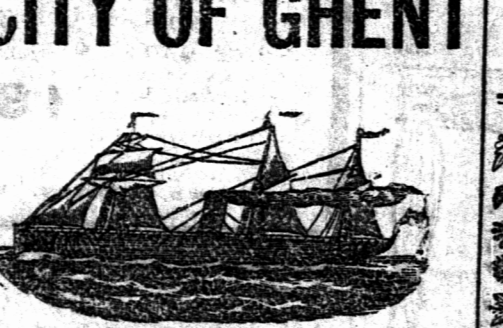

These were fine specimens of this popular and valuable breed. The bull is 2 years old and weighs in modern condition 1650 lbs. The heifers are yearlings and are large and handsome. These animals will be joined at Quebec by 5 head more now in quarantine there and recently imported from Scotland by Mr. Richards. Together they will be taken to Toronto there to compete for show yard honors with the best that Canada and America can produce. This is probably the first exhibit of cattle ever made at Toronto from the Island, if not from the lower provinces. The Toronto Fair is one of the largest and best equipped in the world and its show of live stock is not surpassed if indeed it is equalled, anywhere. The competition in the different classes of horses and cattle is always very keen, and it takes a good one. To win. Latest reports say that over 800 cattle and 700 horses have already been entered.
