SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON.

AUGUST 31.

THE BRAZEN SERPENT.

Numbers 11:1-9.

(By James M Gray, D. D.)

Golden Text.—As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up: that whosoever believeth in him, should not perish, but have eternal life.—John iii., 14, 15.

The unbelief and rebellion of the people as evinced at Kadesh in the matter of the spies, aroused the indignation of Jehovah as in the case of the golden calf at Sinai. Speaking after the manner of men, again would he have disinherited them but for the intercession of Moses on their behalf. (xv., 11-21.) Nevertheless, he decrees that that generation shall die in the wilderness from twenty years old and upward except the two faithful ones, Caleb and Joshua, and their children only shall enter upon the land. The men who brought the evil report died by the plague. (xv., 20-37.)

And yet, notwithstanding all this, the people sin again. This time by presuming to attempt to take the land anyway, in their own strength, and contrary to the divine will. No wonder they were ignominiously defeated and driven back. The first experience of the kind with which they had met on their journeyings. When God is with us, and he is always with us when we are walking in obedience all is victory; but in his absence all is defeat. This is as true to-day as it was then. (xv., 40-45.)

God now commands them to go into the wilderness again by the way of the Red Sea, to return on their tracks, indeed and it is in the course of this part of their wanderings that the event of the present lesson occurs.

THE LESSON CATECHISM.

We may pass over the first three verses of the chapter, as being in a measure irrelevant to our theme, beginning our catechism at verse 4. From what point did they now start forward on their journey? This place is memorable as that of the death of Aaron. (See the preceding chapter, verse 22-29.) What land did they have to go around? Examine the map here. Edom was the land given to the descendants of Esau, the brother of Jacob, the human founder of the nation of Israel, and hence the Edomites were really blood relations of the Israelites. Their conduct, therefore, which made necessary this wide detour on the part of Israel was very unkind and reprehensible. Let the teacher read the story in chapters xx., 14-21, in order to explain it intelligently to the class. God has not forgotten this treatment of his people Israel by Edom, and the prophets tell us that the punishment fallen upon the nation long ago is not the whole of it by any means. As the result of this long and wearisome journey what effect is produced on the spirits of the Israelites? (Verse 4.) What did their discouragement lead them to do? (Verse 5.) The 'light' or vile bread they loathed, you will doubtless recognize as the manna which had been given them from Heaven, on the strength of which they were able to perform their 'tollsome journey for forty years.'

What punishment is now sent upon them? (6.) What was the effect of the punishment on them? (7.) How does their language show that they had come to know God better than they did? How is the love and consideration of Moses again displayed? What provision does God now make for the healing of the people and their deliverance from this plague? (8.) Is the provision complied on their part? And with what result?

We learn from the commentaries that 'that part of the desert where the Israelites now were—probably near the head of the gulf of Akaba—is greatly infested with venomous reptiles of various kinds, particularly lizards, which rise themselves in the air and swing themselves from branches; and scorpions, which being in the habit of lying among long grass, are particularly dangerous to the bare-legged, sandalled people of the East. The serpents that caused so great mortality among the Israelites are not specifically described except by the word 'fiery,' which may refer either to their color or the violent inflammation caused by their bite. If the Israelites had been obedient and faithful to God, they might have walked on the reptiles without fear. (Psalm 91:9, 14.)

THE LESSON AS A TYPE.

This is one of the Old Testament lessons whose Golden Text is to be regarded as an integral part of it. Teachers should read and re-read in the spirit of earnest prayer, the whole of the context of the latter in the third chapter of John, and ask themselves in what sense or in what particulars the brazen serpent may be regarded as a type of Christ. These thoughts suggest themselves; 1. In the

need which gave occasion for it, viz., the sin of the people, with its inevitable punishment of death. "The soul that sloneth it shall die." (Ezekiel 18:20.) "The wages of sin is death." (Romans 6:23) This shows us why we need a Saviour as the Israelites needed the brazen serpent. 2. In its divine origin. It was God's own plan, His own devising for saving His people. The Israelites themselves did not conceive of it, and had they done so it would have been ineffectual of course. So Christ our Saviour is God's gift to the world, God's way, and hence the only way, of our salvation. (John 8:10.)

3. In its likeness to the cause of their distress. It was a serpent that injured them, and it was the likeness of that serpent that healed him. So in our case, it is sin in the flesh that condemns us, and Christ our Substitute was made in the likeness of sinful flesh, and judged sin in the flesh, and bare our sins in his own body on the tree. (Romans vii., 3; I. Peter ii., 24.)

4. In the conspicuousness of its position. It was elevated on a pole, and doubtless on a high place in the centre of the camp, easy of access to the eye of every afflicted one. So Christ was lifted up upon the Cross in the great city of Jerusalem, at that particular period in the history of the Roman Empire, and of the world, when the facilities for spreading the glad-tidings and thus bringing Him to the eyes of all men had never been so perfected.

5. Other points of comparison will crowd upon the mind of the reflective and prayerful teacher such as the freeness of the remedy, its simplicity, its applicability to all, its entire sufficiency, its absolute certainty, its demand for faith and for that alone, and its call for the unflinching gratitude of them whose lives it spared.—'Union Gospel News.'
