**SEIZED MAPLE SUGAR BELOW STANDARD**

**OTTAWA, Jan. 13.**—The Department of Health makes the following announcement: Sixty-two boxes of so-called maple sugar and a large quantity of maple butter have been seized at a wholesale house in Ottawa by the food inspectors of the Department of Health, under authority of the Adulteration Act. It has been found at the Department's food and drug laboratories that the material, which was to be sold as maple sugar contained glucose and refined sugar and therefore, was adulterated. Acting under Section 29 of the Act, the material has been seized and forfeited to the Crown. The adulterated character of the maple-butter was also proved and it was seized and
