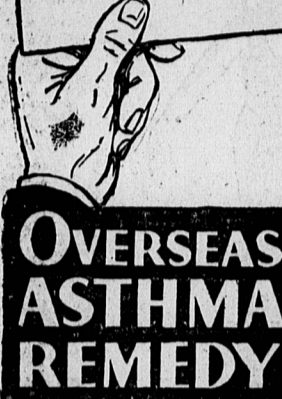

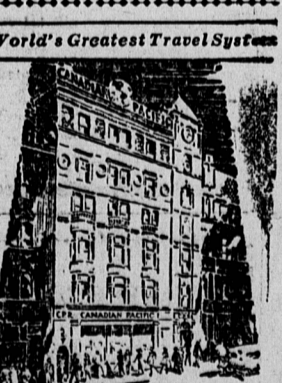

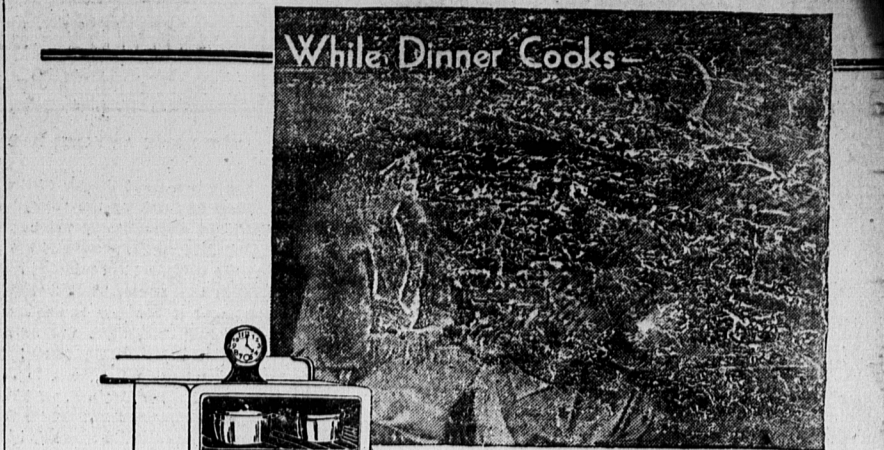
About sixty guests were present at the observance of the Golden Wedding on Monday all of whom presented the venerable couple with suitable remembrances.

Tables were arranged on the lawn where a bountiful repast was served a three storey bride's cake occupying the centre of the table.

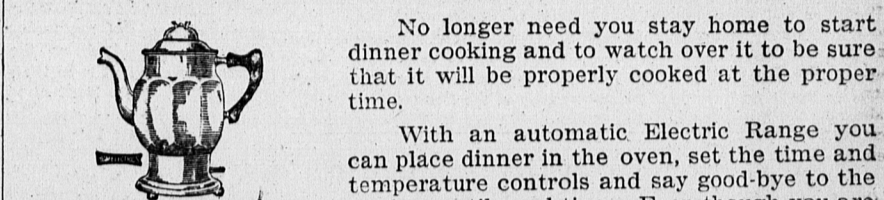
In the evening a dancing floor was arranged where the young people enjoyed themselves. Before dispersing dainty refreshments were served.
