ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

The rendition of Steiner's Crucifixion will be given in St. James Church next Monday evening. At a recent meeting of the Sunday School at Union, Jas. Esery was unanimously re-elected as superintendent. A LARGE number of people took advantage of the beautiful day yesterday to spend the afternoon at Rocky Point. The death occurred in Milton, Mass., June 1, of Miss Virginia, daughter of George C Innis, formerly of Summerside P. E. I. PARON & Co., are receiving a great many answers to their Black Cat ad both from city and country. All answers must be in before the schools close for the summer holidays. The Sunday School district of north-west Queen's will hold its semi-annual convention in the Presbyterian Church at New Glasgow on Monday, June 20th, next, afternoon session beginning at 2.30 o'clock, evening session at 7. Rev. Mr. Archibald, the new Field Secretary is expected to be present. Rev. A. L. Gaggie, Park St. Church, Toronto, whose health is in an unsatisfactory state, superinduced by a heavy cold, has been granted a leave of absence by his congregation, and leaves on the 27th inst. for a visit to Scotland. He will be accompanied by Mrs. Gaggie and two of their sons. Mr. Gaggie's stipend has been increased from \$2,000 per annum to \$3,000, and for the purpose of further giving him expressions of goodwill the whole expenses of travel to and from Scotland for himself, wife and family have been contributed by the session. The British survey, steamer Ellnor, which arrived at North Sydney, on Sunday was formerly owned by the Sultan of Morocco, having been built and elaborately fitted up as a private yacht. Some years ago while cruising in the Mediterranean her entire crew were murdered. It was supposed that the Sultan at the time the tragedy occurred was on board, and the attempt that resulted in the murder of the boat's entire crew, was against his life. The boat was immediately sold to the British government by the Sultan and is now used as a survey boat.—Sydney Record.

The annual convention of the Lord's Day Alliance of Prince Edward Island will be held in the Baptist Church, Charlottetown, on Thursday next the 16th inst. Delegates from different parts of the Province will be in attendance. There will be an afternoon session at 3 o'clock and an evening session at 8 o'clock. The General Secretary for Canada, Rev. J. G. Shearer, and the Associate Secretary, Rev. T. Albert Moore will be present. His addresses and supply the fullest information with reference to the Lord's Day question. As many as possible should show their interest in the work of the Alliance by attending both the afternoon and evening meetings, to which all are invited.

The meeting of District Division of the Sons of Temperance which met at Long Creek on Saturday afternoon, notwithstanding the stormy weather, passed off very successfully. 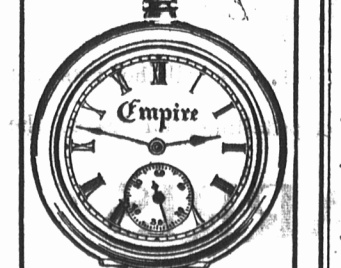
