FUTURE OF CANADA HOLDS BIGGER THINGS

So Declared the Minister of Railways in Guiding Through the Hoop the Measure to Guarantee the Bonds of Canadian Northern, for Line Linking the East and West.

OTTAWA, May 17.—"The future for Canada holds bigger things," said Hon. George P. Graham, Minister of Railways, in guiding the measure to guarantee the bonds of the Canadian Northern Railway line, linking the Eastern and Western systems through the Commons this afternoon. Parliament would be recreant to its public trust should it fail to embrace the opportunity to secure this valuable link by mere lending of the national name. There was traffic ample to keep three transcontinentals busy, while it was planned to improve the waterways also.

WILL GET THE TRADE

"I thought the Government was planning to develop the transportation North and South," put in Mr. Lancaster caustically. "We are not such little Canadians," responded the Minister of Railways, "to fail to realize that our transportation facilities will have all they can do if they are kept up to the requirements. Canada has the open ports, and if she has courage to provide the carrying facilities she will get the carrying trade."

SOUND STATESMANSHIP

It was a striking tribute to the sound statesmanship of the Minister of Railways and the Government in declaring this agreement with the railway, that the Bill which is perhaps the most important of the session went through the House, without any serious amendment being suggested by the Opposition, and without any sustained objection to its provisions. There was considerable criticism during the debate on the measure but that criticism was not based upon any very sincere conviction was evidenced by the fact that no vote was challenged either in the committee stage, or on the third reading. The chief criticism made against the Bill were on the score that there was inadequate information as to the probable cost of the line, or as to its location, and because of its introduction in the House at this late date when it could not be given the close scrutiny it deserved.

ANOTHER BIG WHITE STAR LINER FOR THE ST. LAWRENCE.

"Teutonic" makes First Trip. Growing Trade Demands Best Ships.

The Big White Star Liner "Teutonic" arrived at Quebec this morning en route to Montreal on her first voyage to Canada, with over 500 cabin and nearly 900 third class passengers, a record list.

The fine lines and graceful proportions of the ship are quite a contrast to most vessels coming to this port. The "Teutonic" is the longest steamer ever seen in this river, having an over-all length of 582 feet, and with her powerful engines of 18,000 horsepower, capable of developing a speed of 20 knots an hour. It is expected she will win the blue ribbon honors on the St. Lawrence route.

The "Teutonic" will carry cabin passengers in one class only and third class passengers. The accommodation has been greatly enlarged, and a fine Ladies Room has been added to the public rooms, which also include a spacious and beautifully decorated lounge and a Smoking Room. The Staterooms are large and airy, and the Promenade Decks are broad and extensive.

The Third Class has also been rearranged and all passengers will be berthed in closed cabins, with the former Second Class Smoking Saloon has been converted for their use, and a fine Lounging Room has been provided on deck.

The "Teutonic" has been a popular favorite on the Southampton-New York run, where she is to be replaced by the giant "Olympic," and judging from the list she is bringing out on her first trip to Canada, that popularity will cling to her in this trade.

The wonderful growth in travel to and from Montreal is bringing great changes in the facilities provided for passengers by the big steamship lines, and new and larger vessels are being diverted to the St. Lawrence every year. Thousands of tourists prefer it to any other route, as it reduces the actual ocean voyage to less than four days, while the trip on the river and through the broad expanse of the Gulf is a panorama of scenic interest not to be found elsewhere.

Mr. Graham pointed out that any one who was at all acquainted with the character of the country through which a road would run, would not doubt the correctness of the engineering estimate that the cost per mile would be at least \$50,000 or \$15,000 in excess of the bond guarantee. As to the omission of a specific clause in the Bill locating the line definitely, he noted that the route from Port Arthur to Montreal had already been approved by the Department, and that the specific determination of the line in the Bill would prevent any possible deviation from this which it might be found necessary to make later on, owing to engineering difficulties. There were two or three minor amendments incorporated in the Bill, one specifying that the bond guarantee shall not be applicable to more than 1,050 miles on line, and a second, providing that before the guarantee is given by the Government the agreement with regard to exchanging of traffic with the Intercolonial at Montreal shall be drafted.

OF A HIGH STANDARD

In the course of the discussion Mr. Porter said that there was an impression in some quarters that Mackenzie and Mann were raising on the issues on their lines more money than was spent in construction, and were thus growing rich in the process, while Mr. Monk declared that in some parts of Quebec where the line would be run the road could be built for less than \$35,000 per mile.

Mr. Borden also complained that there seemed to be no definite information available as to what the road would actually cost, and whether there was any necessity for so high a guarantee. To all these objections Mr. Graham replied that provision was made to have the road constructed on a high standard, and that the best information available from engineers who had carefully considered the whole project was that the cost per mile would be many thousands in excess of the bond guarantee. His own opinion was that it would probably run over \$60,000 per mile.

COUNT ZEPPELIN'S

NEWEST DIRIGIBLE ENDS IN DISASTER

DUESSELDORF, Rhenish Prussia, May 18.—After a career of six weeks the Deutschland II., last of the models of Count Zeppelin's ill-fated dirigible balloons, stranded today on the roof of its shed, a complete wreck.

The finish of the airship was less spectacular than that of its predecessors, but more complete. The crew and passengers escaped injury.

The accident occurred as the Deutschland was being released from a passenger trip. Eight passengers, four men and four women, had seated themselves comfortably in the cabin, the crew was at post and two hundred men on the ground clung to the guide ropes as the powerful craft slowly emerged from her berth and under pressure of more than half a million cubic feet of gas struggled to leave.

Just as the airship cleared the shed a violent gust of wind drove her back against the entrance. At the impact several of the balloonets burst and the released gas destroyed her equilibrium.

The array of men at the guide ropes clung desperately, but were powerless against the wind, and another gust lifted the airship bodily and dropped her upon the roof of the shed, her back broken and her hull left dangling over one edge.

In this position the crew and passengers rudely shaken, but not seriously injured, were left helpless until a fire brigade hurriedly summoned to the scene ran ladders to the top of the shed and pulled the marooned ones out of the wreck.

The Deutschland II. was built to replace the earlier craft of the same name, which went to her end in the Teutoburgian Forest on June 28 last. The motors and the vertical steering planes of the original Deutschland were saved and utilized in the construction of her successor. The latter made her maiden flight on March 30 last and had since made several successful trips. One of the most notable of these was in April, when Count Zeppelin took the dirigible from Friedrichshafen to Stuttgart and, circling over the royal palace, dropped a bouquet with his greetings to King William II. of Wurttemberg and Queen Charlotte, on the occasion of their silver wedding anniversary.

Today was the sixth serious accident which has befallen the Zeppelin I., the Zeppelin II., the Zeppelin III., and the new Deutschland II. all have come to grief after short though brilliant lives.

TOO MUCH READING MADE TORONTO MAN VIOLENTLY INSANE

TORONTO, May 17.—Without a moment's warning, Charles Collins, of 276 Richmond street west, went wildly insane yesterday, and threatened the lives of his wife and four children. Last night he was sent to the insane asylum.

The cause of the remarkable delirium, which may or may not be permanent, was the excessive reading of books. Collins carried his ungodly literature to excess, and would lie awake all night and let meal time pass without relaxing his perusal of magazines and books.
