Carpentier's Final Bout

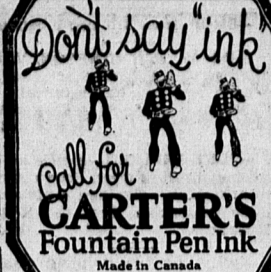
PARIS, May 10.—Georges Carpentier's bout with Battling Siki here on September 16 next will be his last, according to L'Auto.

"I hurt my left hand in the fifth round of the Nilles fight, and my right, too, in landing the uppercut which ended the bout," Carpentier told L'Auto's reporter.

According to present plans Georges will fight Mike McTigue in New York on July 14.



Weather Man Stops Ball Games

NEW YORK, May 10.—Rain, cold weather and snow today played havoc with baseball schedules, causing the postponement of eleven out of sixteen games in the Major Leagues, International League and American Association.

Five Major League games, two in the National and three in the American League were postponed because of weather conditions. All of the International League teams were forced into idleness, while two American Association contests also were called off.

Snow caused postponements of the American League game in Detroit between the Tigers and Washington, and at Rochester between Baltimore and Rochester, International League Clubs.

British Golf Champ Defeated

DEAL, England, May 10.—The elimination of E. W. E. Holderness, the present champion, and the victories of Cyril Tolley and Roger Wethered, featured the third round of play for the British amateur golf championship today.

The weather was fine and the course of the Royal Cinque Ports Club was in the best of condition. Francis Outmet, Boston, the United States star, held the interest of a large gallery, while he won his match.

EXPLAINS UNSEASONABLE WEATHER OVER VAST AREA

TORONTO, May 11.—Sir Frederick Stupart, director of the meteorological survey of Canada in an interview today explains just why the country is being treated to such unseasonable weather as has prevailed over so widespread an area.

"In connection with the late spring of this year," said Sir Frederick, "it has been shown that the persistent development of areas of high pressure in Arctic America and their subsequent movement south-eastward hastened abnormal flow of air from the northward over Central and Eastern Canada, bringing with it the low temperature of higher latitudes. In weather changes persistency of type is to be expected and there is always a tendency towards a repetition of somewhat similar weather conditions. The type which prevailed during most of the past winter and spring is not yet broken and the present cold wave is quite similar to many that have occurred in months past. It is a flow of air from the far north filling in behind a barometric depression passing slowly eastward across southern Canada.

"It should be remembered that while the abnormal atmospheric currents of the past few months have been such as to cause cold weather in central and eastern Canada the complementary currents add the complementary currents on our Pacific coast and in Great Britain have led in these regions to abnormally mild and pleasant weather.

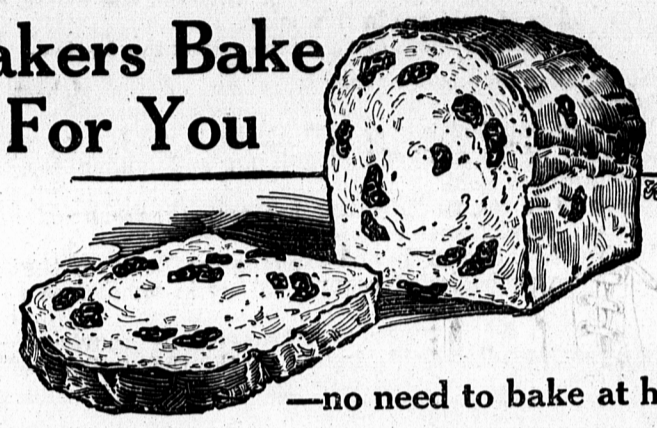
