BANNER CHARLOTTETOWN MEETING IN THE MARKET HALL LAST NIGHT

The Conservative Candidates Received the Lion's Share of the Applause and We re Given a Splendid Hearing. There Was a Full Discussion of the Actions of the Bell Government, the Poll Tax Coming in for Special Attention

The splendid political meeting in the Market Hall last night, the large attendance which nearly filled the building and the perfect order which prevailed, was evidence of the lively interest which the campaign has created among citizens. Not once was it necessary for the chairman to call order and the only interruption came from one of the Liberal members, Mr. Duffy, during the closing remarks of Dr. McMillan. Thirty minutes were allowed to each speaker, with ten minutes at the close for the opening candidate; and only the candidates spoke. They were limited strictly to the half hour, and there was not the slightest restlessness shown by the audience.

(Canadian Press) SPRINGFIELD, July 19.—Miners at Westville went back to work this morning and other mines in the Pictou area will follow suit, according to a message received at Springhill this morning. It is expected that the majority of the mines on the mainland will side with John L. Lewis against the McLaughlin faction. McLaughlin is expected to continue a fight against the Lewis syndicate. W. J. Callegary and B. A. Franston, both U. M. W. officials, reached Springhill this morning, and left for Glace Bay to consult Silby Harrett. More men returned to work this morning, numbering about fifty. There are now 1,751 men working in the steel plant. Eighteen hundred tons of coal moved from pit Number Two yesterday.
