OTTAWA RUMOR OF INTEREST AFFECTING QUEBEC PREMIER.
OTTAWA, April 19—Quebec members arriving here today are discussing an interesting political rumor. There is a suggestion that Hon. L. P. Brodeur, after the session, will be appointed to the Supreme Court Bench, and that he may be succeeded as Minister by Sir Lomer Gouin, who for one session at least, if not permanently, would go to the Senate, succeeding to the place of the late Senator Forget. At the general election, it is said, he might run in St. James Division, Mr. Gervais being elevated to the Bench.
As Provincial Premier, Hon. Alexandre Taschereau would succeed Sir Lomer.
The appointment of Sir Lomer would overcome the objection urged in certain quarters to Hon. Mr. Brodeur's prospective successor being other than a Montreal district man. The story so far, is only of the character of gossip, and no definite development is looked for for a few months.
Sir Louis Jette is mentioned as the successor of Sir Elzear Taschereau on the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council.

USE OF TELEPHONE AS A MEANS OF DISPATCHING TRAINS.
WASHINGTON, April 22—The extent to which the telephone has encroached on the telegraph as a means of dispatching trains during 1910 is shown in a bulletin issued today by the inter-state commerce commission. An increase of 15,373 miles of railroad on which the telephone is used was shown during the year. On January 1, 1911, the telegraph was used on 175,211 miles and the telephone on 41,717 miles.
The bulletin also shows that there were at the beginning of the year 71,269 miles of railroad in the United States operated under the block signal system, 17,711 miles of which were automatic. The increase in this system in 1910 was 5,473 miles, 3,473 miles being automatic.

DYNAMITER CAUGHT—GOOD DETECTIVE WORK.
INDIANAPOLIS, April 24—After months of investigation, directed by William Burns, San Francisco, the Detective agency, John McNamara, the International Secretary of Structural Iron Workers of America, head quarters in Indianapolis, was arrested here charged with complicity in the dynamiting of the Los Angeles Times in October, 1910 and the Plant of the Llewellyn Iron Works.
Four hours after McNamara was arrested the detectives found two quarts of nitro-glycerine and 11 sticks of dynamite in a barn three quarters of a mile west of Indianapolis. The barn was rented by McNamara.
