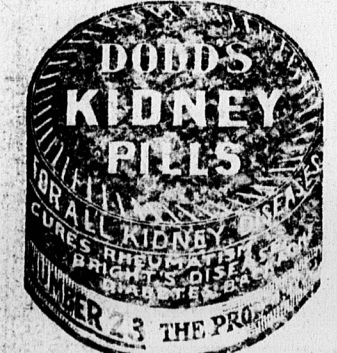

Forty-nine live snakes found. BOUNDARY CREEK, Mar. 9.—While A. A. Henry and Edward O'Brien were digging swamp muck on Thursday for fertilizer in a barren of about 100 acres in extent, belonging to Mrs. Barbara Fowles of Montreal and bordering on A. A. Henry's farm, they came upon a nest of forty-nine live snakes by actual count. They were two feet below the surface of the ground and well below the frost level. They were very dull and sluggish and were near the side of a narrow lake that winds through the barren, and were in a hollowed out place about five feet long, which they nearly filled. They appeared to be the ordinary brownish colored snake, and were of all sizes, from about eighteen inches long to full grown ones of three feet or over in length.

Although Mr. Henry and others have dug in this barren these last fifty years, they have never seen or heard of anything of the kind before, and hope never to see the like again. eleven-twenty.
