PREFERENTIAL TRADE DEBATED

In the Legislative Assembly—Strong Speech of the Opposition Leader—Various Phases of the Subject Considered in a Thoughtful Manner—Best Discussion of the Session.

MONDAY, APRIL 10. Mr. Mathieson moved the following Resolution: Resolved that in the opinion of this House the prosperity of Canada would be greatly increased by a customs arrangement between Great Britain and her Colonies whereby preferential treatment would be granted by Great Britain in her markets to the products of the Colonies and a preferential advantage in the interchange of commodities prevail throughout the British Empire.
