POULTRY SHOW.—The eighth annual show of the Prince Edward Island Poultry Association will be opened in Charlottetown on Wednesday next, December 15, and will extend over Thursday and Friday. Entries closed on Saturday and judging by the number on the list, the show promises to be at least up to the standard if not better than previous exhibitions. Prizes will be offered in 24 classes, which include Plymouth rocks, Wyandottes, Orpingtons, Leghorns, Minorcas, Rhode Island Reds, Langshires, Brahms, game birds of different varieties, andoussians, cockins, dorkings, bantams, ducks, and geese. A prize of \$1.00 will be given for the best dozen brown shelled eggs, 2nd prize 50 cents and similar prizes for best dozen white-shelled eggs. Ribbons will be given in the dressed poultry class, one section of which is to be "best dozen chicks packed for export." A number of special prizes are offered, among which are silver cups, one donated by Mr. P. C. Brown for best cock and hen, one variety, any standard breed to be won three times, and another by Mr. W. N. Tanton for best five males and five females of any variety owned by exhibitor three months before the show, to be won three times in succession. All exhibits must be delivered by noon on Tuesday, but an allowance will be made in the case of birds coming by rail and from outside the town that may be delayed on account of storms.

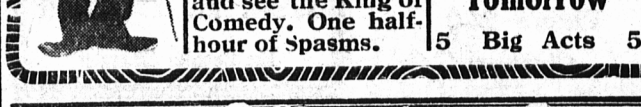
