AYRSHIRE NOTES

Mr. C. A. Archibald of Truro, N. S. Maritime Live Stock Promoter left for the mainland yesterday. During his visit he purchased a number of pure bred Ayrshire bulls to be used by the Live Stock Branch in their system of loaning sires to co-operative breeding societies throughout the country. Among those purchased were six from Mr. B. R. Brown, Brightside Farm, York. These animals are all from dams qualified in the record of performance one of them being out of Queen the dam of Mr. Brown's noted cow Queen's Own which gave last year over 16,000 lbs milk and 753 lbs butter fat.

Among the records completed by Brightside Farm during the past year were six two year old heifers which made an average production of over 10,000 lbs of milk.

A choice bull was secured from McRae Bros of New Wiltshire of a promising young cow sired by Hobsland Tompkins Heir imported by McRae and Sons of Charlottetown.

These bulls were shipped with a consignment of Ayrshires purchased to form the foundation of a herd on the Mount Vincent Farm near Halifax.

Three cows for this purpose were purchased from Mr. John McLeod of Darlington, these cows trace back to the Miller herd at Marshfield and are a splendid combination of Ayrshire type and producing ability, having been prize winners at Charlottetown Exhibition, one of these cows viz. Daisy, having produced a high as 72 lbs milk per day testing 4% butter fat. The other two are
