Romance Ended Musical Career Of Mrs. Dewey

(By Marianne Isaak, Canadian Press Staff Writer) NEW YORK, Oct. 7.—(CP)—A woman who once toured the United States in George White's "Scandals" may become the next First Lady of the land. There was a time when starring on Broadway was the ambition of Frances Eileen Hutt. But when she met young Tom Dewey at a singing contest in Chicago in 1923, she forgot about that. When she married him in 1928, the only career she thought of was that of wife and mother. Now her husband, governor of New York State, is Republican candidate for the presidency, for the second time. Mrs. Dewey was born in Sherman, Texas, in 1903, but her family moved to Sapula, Okla., shortly after. They still live there. From early girlhood she studied singing. Her teacher was so impressed with her voice that she urged her to come to New York for further study. This Frances did and was well on the way to becoming a singing star when she met Dewey. But she says she had no regrets at not climbing to the top of the theatrical ladder. "Every woman should follow her own bent," she says. "My bent for years has been toward being my husband's wife." Slender, about average height, with delicate coloring and features, Mrs. Dewey would be numbered among the more attractive wives of presidents. Her manner is gracious and warm but not over effusive. Sense of Humor She has a sense of humor that enables her to laugh at herself; and a wit that often surprises those who consider her reticent. Since her marriage, Mrs. Dewey has lived in a 2 1/2-room flat in New York, a more commodious

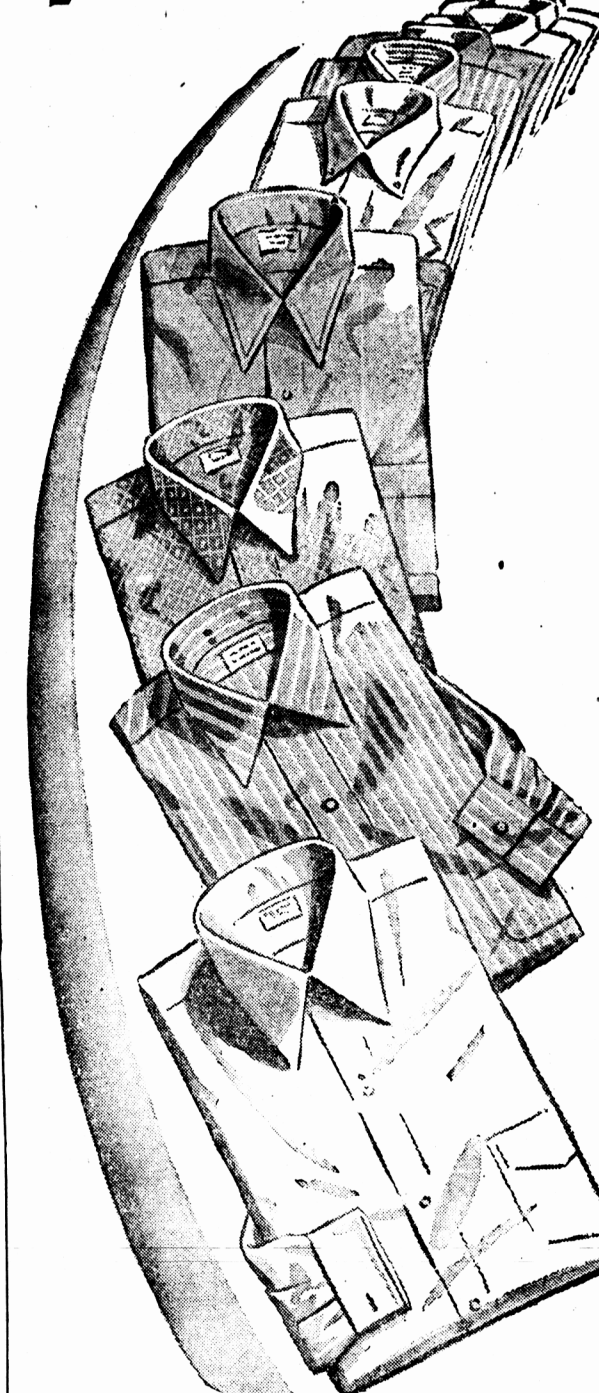

Regina Firemen Build Own Truck

REGINA, Oct. 8.—(CP)—When the Regina fire department needs a new truck it builds one. And thanks to Fire Chief W.O. Moffatt and Gus Dombrook, veteran of 27 years with the department, the trucks are pretty nifty. The department needed a new truck last summer so they placed an order for a standard four-ton type before Gus went to work. Using Chief Moffatt's plans, he lengthened the frame three feet to carry the fire-fighting apparatus and then constructed metal racks and compartments firemen use to hold a surprising number of things. He installed a power take-off for the booster pump and added the siren and safety lights. Chief Moffatt says there's two reasons why the department went a little further than usual in this particular job. Gus had added to—and subtracted from—much of the Regina equipment but he'd never built one practically from the ground up. She refuses to campaign or make speeches—"I'm not the speaker for this family," she says. To questions about her expectations for her husband's election she merely says: "I don't know—I haven't a crystal ball."
