—The latest news, first of all.
—Elisha Wright, Summerside, has arrived home from a business trip to Nova Scotia.
—Senator Thompson, Fredericton, N. B., is the guest of Senator Yeo, Port Hill, for a few days.
—Hector McQuarrie, Wilmet, left by the Empress yesterday on a visit to his son, who lives in Sussex, N. B.
—J. J. Hughes, Shamrock, was in Summerside yesterday and sold a very fine mare to John McDonald.
—Messrs Dalton and Olive, Dominion Government Inspector of steamboats, crossed over to this Province by the Empress last evening.
—Mrs. David Lawson, who has been visiting in Charlottetown for the past few weeks, has left for Summerside, where she will reside for some time.
—The sacrament of the Lord's Supper will be observed in the Presbyterian Church, Summerside tomorrow Sunday morning, July 4th at 11 a. m.
—The City of Ghent sailed from Summerside yesterday morning after taking on board five hundred bags potatoes, one hundred boxes cheese and some sundries.
—In Alberton yesterday butter sold at 14 to 17 cents a lb., oats at 20 cents a bus., wool at nineteen and twenty cents a lb., eggs at 15 cents a doz and potatoes at 25 cents a bus.

—The marriage is announced to take place on July 4th, at Haverhill, Mass., of Miss S. H. Crehan, daughter of H. Crehan, Shamrock, to A. A. Malone, formerly of Kelly's Cross.
—Mrs. James Saunders, Cambridge, Mass., arrived by the Empress last evening and will spend the summer with her mother, Mrs. John Ramsay, Summerside. Her sister, Miss Bertha, who has been in Cambridge came home with her.
—There were five offenders before the Summerside police court yesterday morning, four of whom were common drunks and were fined the usual two dollars and costs. The other was for interfering with a police officer while making an arrest. He was fined ten dollars and costs.
—R. S. Bowness, the keeper of the Meteorological Station at Summerside reports for the month of June as follows: We have had nearly one and a half inches of rain, which means nearly one hundred and fifty tons of water to the acre. From the first of the month to the twelfth was very dry. Leaves were out on the eighth. There was light thunder three times during the month. The warmest was 81 during lowest temperature 38 a. m. which occurred on the 1st. We had thirteen days of bright sunshine, fifteen days partially cloudy and two days with impervious clouds. New hay meadows look well. Other crops in general are looking well.

—The annual examination of the Bideford School took place on Tuesday afternoon June 29th. A number of the rate payers besides several visitors were present. The examination was conducted by the teacher, Miss Pearl Hopgood, assisted by Rev. E. S. Weeks. Much satisfaction was expressed at the promptness with which the pupils answered the searching questions put to them. Two prizes for general proficiency given by Mrs. (Hon.) John Richards, were won by 1st Glen Williams, and 2nd Jas. McDonald. At the conclusion of the examination several excellent recitations were given by the pupils, after which several of the rate-payers addressed the school in a commendable way for the success of the examination. Regret was expressed that Miss Hopgood could not remain another year, and best wishes for her future welfare. During Miss Hopgood's stay in Bideford she has made many friends and become very popular among the residents.
