### AN EXCELLENT HOCKEY PORTRAIT

In Prowse Bros window a splendid display picture by Mr. Jas. Bayer shows the "Vics" in action, and in the border the players appear individually, along with the Executive. On the whole the picture is one of the finest of its kind that Mr. Bayer has succeeded in producing. The Star Trophy, the possession of which marks the Champions of the Maritime Provinces in Amateur Hockey, is also conspicuously displayed along with the trophy that announces the Champions of P. E. Island.

Perhaps no more important Trophy ever came to Prince Edward Island than this piece of silverware, certainly nothing for which there is such keen competition in the realm of hockey. In the spring of 1911 the Vics went to New Glasgow to play North Sydney on neutral ice for this coveted prize, and in two games which ensued, succeeded in outclassing the Cape Breton team. Since that time the trophy has been a bone of contention between the Champions of the different Leagues in P. E. Island, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick. In 1912 the Orioles of Halifax, Champions of the Nova Scotia League, came to lift the Trophy, and again this Spring two teams came from Nova Scotia, the the Tecs from Halifax and the Baptists from Amherst, and their poor showing is still fresh in the memory of the fans who witnessed the games.

During the time the Victorias have held the Star Trophy, the other clubs in the city have shown themselves to be good sports, in upholding the Vics in their endeavors to retain silverware, and in every way making it quite plain to all concerned that it was "Charlottetown's" first, Club afterward.

The P. E. Island League trophy is now owned outright by the Victorias, as is also the Intermediate Trophy, and, on the whole, the Victoria Club is in a very pleasing and unique position in holding "everything" in the shape of a Hockey Championship trophy in the Maritime Provinces.

There were there but the former government did not see it to move in the matter. The province also receives to-day a large revenue from the fox industry. It might be asked what has the government to do with this? To this he would answer that the government, by changes in the administration of law and order had done much to encourage the industry. Through lawlessness in certain sections of the province it became a matter of serious doubt whether ranches could be safely established. Foxes were stolen and a general feeling of danger existed. It became necessary for the government to employ detectives to take such steps as would safeguard the industry. The government's determination to enforce the law had created a feeling of security. This was also true with reference to the Prohibition Act. The law was being shamelessly violated. In King's County one place, which had conducted a liquor business for the past fifteen years, had been closed by the present government.

The records show that in all the previous years the only payment made by that house was a fine of \$25. The present government, at considerable expense, succeeded in routing it out. They employed a lawyer and it cost the government \$100. No sooner was this done than the Opposition raised a hue and cry about the expense of appointing a lawyer. Yet the government considered that they had done a good thing even for this outlay in closing the place up.

Not many years ago he had occasion to point out in this House that fifteen or twenty liquor sellers were walking the streets of Charlottetown with lines hanging over their heads.

MR. RICHARDS: "Does not this same condition prevail to-day? Are there not fines that are not collected?"

HON. MR. MCKINNON asked if the honourable gentleman had the reports, to which the Leader of the Opposition replied that he had not but could name several who had not paid their fines.

MR. MCKINNON continuing, said that the government had no such information and the prosecutors' reports would speak for themselves. These reports had been laid on the table.

This condition of lawlessness did not grow in a short time. It was the outcome of lax administration that had continued from year to year. In this matter the government had taken a firm stand and it is known that had it not been for the assurance of better enforcement of law several fox ranches since established in Prince County would have been established in some of the neighboring provinces.

There is also an increased revenue from taxes. This does not necessarily mean higher taxes. It means a more equitable adjustment of taxation. It is not even yet perfect. Many are still paying proportionately more than their neighbors, but quite an improvement has been made and a still better adjustment is to follow.

Besides the testimony of the Leader of the Opposition that it is now an easy matter to have surprises and that the country is on a sound financial basis, there is the testimony of independent auditors, whose statement has already been placed before the House. By this statement, it will be seen that the real financial condition is now definitely known and attested to by the sworn statement of the auditors.

The Hon. Mr. McKinnon went briefly over the accounts showing where improvements had been effected both in revenue and expenditure. The road act, he said, although yet not perfect is working well and he considered it a great improvement on the former system. The people are satisfied that it is an improvement and now that its working is in the hands of the people and that they are taking an interest in it, still greater improvements are in sight. He also reviewed the changes made in the Education Act and ridiculed the statement made by the Leader of the Opposition that the increase in teachers' salaries amounted to only \$12 a head. The Leader of the Opposition had evidently forgotten that during the years his own party was in power there had not only not been an increase in teachers' salaries but that there had been an actual reduction.

Referring to the grants from the Dominion government he said there was still more coming if the Opposition in Ottawa does not succeed, as it is evidently trying to do, in blocking the intention of the government. There is something like \$50,000 coming to us from that source, which will be lost to the province if the Opposition will have its way.

One of the great spending departments of the government is the public works department. In the past this department was used not for the benefit of the country but for the patronage of a few individuals. It is now being used to keep the party in power. All would be pleased to know that this condition of affairs is now over, that the public works will be carried on as economically as the means of the province will permit, that no money will be expended unless it is for the benefit and property of the people.

HON. J. A. McDONALD moved the adjournment of the debate.

The following bills reached the committee stage: An act to incorporate Taylor's Black Fox Co., Ltd., County Courts Amendment Act, an act to incorporate the Black Silver Fox Co., Ltd., of Prince Edward Island, an Act to amend the Interpretation Act.

the Election Act, 1913.

During discussion of clause 115 Dr. Dewar asked why the change in the system of voting.

THE PREMIER explained that vote by ballot was one of the prominent planks in the Conservative platform, and adopted by all Conservative candidates.

DR. DEWAR said he never believed in vote by ballot and did not see any reason why he should support it.

MR. JOHN RICHARDS while not opposing the ballot system was of the opinion that there was little interest taken in the question throughout the country. Many would prefer open voting and if there was a place in the world where open voting could be safely relied on it was in P. E. Island.

THE PREMIER would like to know which side of the question the Hon. Leader of the Opposition was on. He had written something on the blackboard and then wiped it off. He favored the ballot and then was opposed to it, opposed it and then favored it. Vote by ballot was the system in vogue in the most advanced countries in the world and was introduced by the Conservative government because it was a progressive move. He admitted that open voting gave an advantage to the party in power both in provincial and federal elections, but the government, regarding it as the right system, introduced it.

Here a discussion arose as to the original authorship of the ballot system, the Leader of the Opposition claiming it had been introduced by the Liberals and repeated by the Conservatives, the Premier claiming the opposite.

Progress was reported at 11 and the House adjourned till 11 a. m. to-day.
