MORE MEN AND MONEY

LONDON, Aug. 24.—The English papers are warning people that the war is only beginning and that they must be prepared for a long struggle which will tax the resources and manhood of the nation to the utmost limit. While appreciating all the colonies have done, they expect colonies with the population of Canada and Australia to contribute much more in men and money to the Empire than they have yet done.

BRITISH FIGHTING

LONDON, Aug. 24.—The official Bureau gave out the following to-day:—British forces were engaged all day Sunday and until after dark with the enemy in the neighborhood of Mons, Belgium. They held their ground.

HOW THE GERMANS TRIED TO CREATE PANIC.

LONDON, August 22.—As an instance of the organized attempt the German government made to create a money panic here, three London German banks, the Deutsche Bank, Dresdner Bank and the Disconto-Gesellschaft, heeded Canadian Pacific stock from \$30 downwards before the declaration of war, when they were compelled to suspend operations. These banks are now allowed to re-open under government control for the purpose of adjusting accounts. There has been purchasing of Canadian Pacific for bear covering at prices ranging from 157 to 164. The government is confiscating the huge profits so made.

CARDINAL GIBBONS STARTS FOR ROME.

BALTIMORE, Aug. 22.—Cardinal Gibbons who has been spending a short vacation at Spring Lake, N. J., leaves New York this afternoon for Naples. From there he will go direct to Rome.

It was regarded as doubtful whether His Eminence will take part in the conclave which will choose the new Pope. According to the rules of the Church the conclave must open 10 days after the death of the Pope, and because of the European war the Baltimore Archbishop could not reach Rome in less than 13 days from New York.

SILVER PLATE IN HIS SIDE DRAWS LIGHTNING BOLT.

ALTOONA, Pa., Aug. 22.—A silver plate taking the place of several ribs in the body of Charles Feathers, a Pennsylvania brakeman, attracted a bolt of lightning in a fierce storm here.

Feather's throat is completely paralyzed, although he is perfectly conscious and suffers no pain. The trainman was standing on his porch, and near him was his son. The bolt struck between the two, but the boy was uninjured, while Feathers was knocked down. The bolt loosened the silver plate in Feather's side. The physicians believe he will recover.

A GROWING HONOUR ROLL

Prince Edward Island's Honor Roll in regard to her contribution of men for the aid of the Empire in her present struggle continues to grow, as loyal response continues to be made to the call to arms that has been sounded throughout the British Dominions.

Two of their fellow-troopers have also enlisted for the front, but as artillerymen. They are Corporal D. A. McDonald and Trooper Neil Walker, who have volunteered to serve with the Fourth Regiment Artillery detachment, and are now in training in Charlottetown.

Prince Edward Island is proud of her loyal sons, who have left and will be leaving her shores with the admiration, goodwill and good wishes and prayers of every man, woman and child on the Island.

PARIS, Aug. 24.—The following official announcement was issued last night:

"Great battle now progressing along the vast line extending from Mons frontier, Luxembourg. Our troops in connection with British, assumed everywhere the offensive and we are faced with the whole German army, both active and reserve. The ground, especially on our right, is thickly wooded and difficult and the battle is likely to last several days. The enormous extent of the front of forces involved makes it impossible to follow step by step the movements of each of our armies. We must await result of fierce phase combat before we can form any conclusion as to the situation, otherwise we should be giving the press divergent and contradictory news."

BATTLE CONFIRMED.
LONDON, Aug. 24.—An official despatch, Reuters Telegram Company, from Antwerp, time 10.50 of clock, Saturday night, tends to confirm the reports of a great battle begun yesterday morning between French and Germans. The despatch says: "Believed that this morning great battle commenced between France and German armies between Namur and Charleroi. Thought will last two or three days. Precise details are lacking."

AUSTRIANS SUFFER SEVERE DEFEAT.

ROME, August 24.—An official despatch from Vienna says that city views the possibility of the arrival of Russian troops there and Vienna has been put in a state of defence.
