## THE PROBLEM OF OTHER SELF

The secret of truly great souls lies in the power of elimination Sermon by Rev. R. W. Norwood, Springhill.

Phil. 3:7—"What things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ."

Life, as we have seen, is only reached in the centres of other-being. Selfishness is death. And the only redemption from the penalty of selfishness is other selflessness. How much are you inspired by what other people are doing? How much interest do you take in the lives of those about you? Are you quickened at the face of a friend in the street, all aglow with its wonders, its visions, its high adventures? The beginning of the religious life is that moment when we look out on our world and say, "how wonderful, how lovely, how good."

And what myriads of other selves there are. Here is the past. Are you uninterested in what men have done before you came into the world? Of course not. Who does not know something about the world's great battles? A life is very poor indeed that is ignorant of those events that lead to the important problems of the moment. This interest in the past is the basis of our present progress. No nation could exist without its annals.

Then there is the interest that the present holds for us. Do you know anybody who is living without an interest in the affairs of to-day? What are the leaders doing and saying in the spheres of politics, science, religion? You may not be interested in them all, but somewhere your attention is won at a moment at the mentioning of the name of the leader of a party whose aims and ideals are in a measure yours. May I ask why every one of you is a reader of at least some paper? Just because you cannot get away from the fascination and power of the other self. Without doubt life is large as we respond to the pull of the greatest scope of individuality. We may respond to what ever forces we will. No one can force us to make our choice. It is true that our early education aims at training the sense for the best other selves so that we may know how and what to choose; but at bottom the choice is our own and we are responsible for it.

Now let us consider what this fact of the other self means. We have reached the conclusion that to be a doer of others. Also it has been shown that intimacy with our selves is the measure of one's personal stature. Can we argue further from this to the conclusion that the fullest, highest life is the knowledge of the most ultimate and perfect other self? That is what Jesus thought when in His prayer He said, "And this is life eternal that they may know Thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom Thou hast sent."

But it is at this point that one of the greatest difficulties of the human mind faces us. How can we be supreme, all powerful other self? I have an answer ready for you which I hope will help you through your difficulty. The process of elimination is the only way to bring you into touch with this largest self. That means that you are immediate and inferior selves. Now what do I mean by inferior? I mean that all other selves are to be regarded as inferior that seek their own, whose existence is wrapped up in the result of merely personal ends. You will have no difficulty in discovering that the majority of other selves are touched with the light of self-seeking. These are the persons whom St. Paul describes as "evil communications" that "corrupt good manners." The problem of other self can never be solved until you have come to see that first you must begin by counting loss all things that bear the hall mark of personal, self-seeking gain on them. Who are your companions? Do they voice your ideals? They could hardly be your companions if they did not express in some way what you are

craving after. If you find that their ideals make away from the highest standard of living, then begin at once by eliminating them from your experiences, the pull of the greatest other selves.

Probably the secret of all truly great souls lies in this power of elimination. It was what the Master was thinking of when He said, "If thy right hand offend thee, cut it off and cast it from thee; for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that the whole body should be cast into hell." To cut away this undergrowth of lesser other selves is not an easy task; yet it is what everyone is called

upon to do who sets out with the light of some high enterprise on his face. Take an example. Knowledge is one of the greatest joys to the student. To feel that one is growing into harmony with lofty minds, sharing their rich experiences, touching some of their greatest interests,—all this is to be alive; and yet, no one may enter into the hall of the mighty who has not turned his back upon all false prophets. One can almost sympathize with the over aesthetic Pope who refused to read the Greek Epistles for fear that their loose style Euripedes. Are you ready and eager for the larger life? Then count everything loss for its sake.

But once more the problem faces us for solution. What is that other self? The larger, that is, the least self-centred. To you and me, who are looking the matter fairly in the face, there can be no doubt in our minds that there is only one other self who perfectly fills in the outlines of the ideal figure, which we have been drawing for ourselves. If life consists in the appreciation of other selves, then Christ stands out among them all as the most true to such conditions, and He has indicated the way to himself as that of self negation: "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself."

Let us take him today at his word. We want life, and He came, not only that we might have it, but that we might have it more abundantly. Clear the obstacles out of the way to Him. The road that we tread is full of waiting difficulties. Why has His face been but as a face in a dream to us these many years? Why has such power touched us on all sides of our impotent lives without shaping us into mighty spirits? Why are we failing to live on the higher plane that we see, that we yearn to reach, that we see others possessing? Because this road that leads to Him is only won by the elimination process of St. Paul.—"What things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ."

Do not take these words lightly. It is no easy matter to count your gains as losses; it is the hardest thing in the world to do so, it means the taking of an inventor of our souls to learn what things therein are marked with the private mark that indicates dedication to self; it means turning over some of your rarest treasures, things that you have stored up for years—dreams, phantom hopes—half-formed wishes. Can you in a moment count these as lost? Ah, it is a hard task, and because it is so hard is the reason why the profession of Jesus tries the best of us and renders us so many irresolute to accept the offer of life through His name.
