A peculiar week is that of December 20th. For five days, the theatrica manager is confronted with what is considered the dulllest time in the amusement year and for two days the holiday spirit will run rampant. In other years, retrenchment was the order of the day; salaries were cut in half, and a general air of gloom obtained around most of the play-houses. To-day, with the modern purveyor of entertainment, things are decidedly different. Take for instance the famed Fifth Avenue Theatre. Even while going on their separate ways, Messrs Keith and Proctor were earnest advocates of the early shopping movement and many seasons ago adopted the bold policy of presenting a vaudeville bill of even higher quality than their usual weekly offerings. This year's bill seems strong enough for a stant music hall of 10,000 seating capacity, and is bound to pack the handsome lower Broadway temple of varieties with a seating room for 2000. Otis Harlan, the rotund comedian, much liked star of a score of musical comedies will begin a short tour of the two-a-day houses, and assisted by a nifty little company, will present a teeny-weeny mirthful plum pudding entitled, "An Accommodating Stranger." All of the Harlan methods of innmaking will be employed while the songs promise to be the catchiest of the season. Next will come none other than that whirlwind European entertainer, Mlle Eugenie Fougere, the idol of Paris, the range of London, the toast of Kings on the Continent, the most talked of woman of a generation. After an absence of nearly five years Mlle Fougere returns with more cunning in her art, about a hundred new songs and costumes which agitate the attention of even blase Paris.

Quite an international aspect is given to the bill when one reflects that the next three acts consist of Michael Fitzgerald and his 8 Juggling Girls, Fred, Ginnett's London comedy success "The Horse Dealer" introducing Mr Ginnett's four wonderful trick horses; and the Howard and Collinson Trio, in another big London novelty, "A Piece of Dresden China." The above three acts are making their American debut and are considered about the best England has ever sent over. Cooper and Robinson, ebony hued comedies will certainly lend color to the bill of all nations, while the Olivetti Troubadours will give a touch of Italian gaiety. Next in favor will come Hastings and Wilson billed by themselves as "The Lunatics." After that title, one need not elaborate, but the young folks are as crazy as the proverbial fox, it is supposed. Lightning Hooper, the crayon artist and the new Keith and Proctor motion pictures will complete the grand assemblage of world-wide novelties.

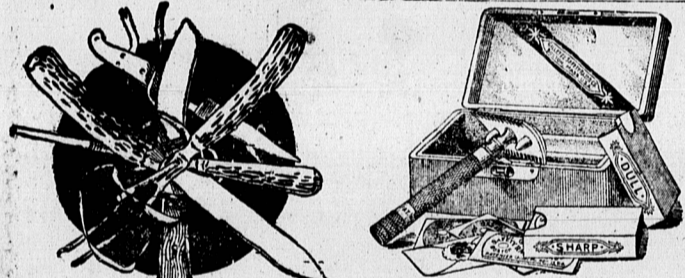
