SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

DECEMBER 12th. PAUL'S LAST WORDS. 2 Tim. 4:1-18. GOLDEN TEXT.

"For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain."—Phil. 1:21.

Some things are inevitable. They are bound to come. We do not like to think of their coming. We would forever push them back. But they cannot be done. Last words—the words which shall be the very last—will be spoken. The last look—the look that shall be the very last—on those mortal shores of time, will be taken.

How wise, therefore, it is to keep in right relations with our fellows. What a mistake it is, often irreparable, to get so out of joint with those we ought to love that the memory of last looks and of last words is a reproach to us and a sorrow unrelieved. It is too late for repentance. The day for apology and reconciliation has passed long ago. The account stands. God forgives, but—

Timothy was in a position to receive a testimony from Paul, which had no sting of regret in it for either. Precious to Timothy must have been the memory of the great apostle's last words. It is given to us to enter into it and make it our own. After a year's study of a life so fully Christian and grandly heroic, measuring more nearly to the standard of the Christ-life than any other, let the last words of the faithful and militant apostle of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles (whose heirs we are) fall upon our ears and sink into our hearts as the sweet-sounding, life-giving, soul-inspiring benediction affixes which assured us from the lips of prayer or as the precious syllable—

Paul tells Timothy to preach the word; to keep on preaching the word; no falter not in preaching the word. This he exports, not because men want to hear it or are asking for it, but for the very reason that they do not always want it, and that sometimes, at least, they ask for false and antagonistic things, and are willing to put up a big price to secure them. False doctrines have cost the people more than the true. More money is put today into superstitious and spurious gospels than into the direct propagation of a direct Christian and spiritual teaching of the truth as it is in Jesus. Nevertheless, in season and out of season, always preach the word.

Paul's whole satisfaction was in the fact that he had been faithful. He had kept the faith. And had fought to keep it. Men had withheld reward, but the crown of righteousness was at hand. The crowns and rewards of men fade. That which he was to receive would fade never.

He was lonesome for the human touch as he neared the time when the cables should loosen. Is it not strange that so often the great and the good have so few friends about them at the last? It would seem that greatness and goodness mean isolation. So many are content to be little and selfish and traitorous: unfaithful. A small excuse takes them from the side of the heroic and sacrificial.

But God is faithful. He stands with His saints and strengthens them. He fulfills every promise made. To Him be the glory!
