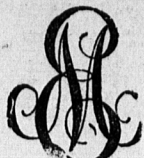

E. A. Wallberg, of Montreal, is in the City. Mr. Wallberg has the contract for the new wharf at Souris, and was the contractor for the new railway station and many of the railway workshops now building in this City. He has had on his payroll in this Province all summer an average of one hundred and fifty men, and a large number of these will be provided with work during the winter. He thinks the outlook in this Province is a very hopeful one for the laboring man. In Moncton, where he has many big contracts, and where many men have been employed, a large percentage of the workmen will be laid off for the winter months. They however are chiefly foreigners—Austrians, and Italians, who live frugally and have saved enough to tide them over the winter without serious discomfort.
