ty of our butter, and second with regard to our quality of cheese. The cause of that is largely due to our industrious and able dairy superintendent, a man whom we placed here since the present Government came into power.

With regard to Education, the expenditure in this department has also been kept within the estimates. Within the last ten years this annual expenditure has increased upwards of \$100,000. It is rather interesting to know that the amount spent for Education today is just about the amount of the total revenue of this province in 1883.

Public Works. With regard to Public Works, the expenditure is slightly above the average expenditure during the past two or three years, but only slightly. Last Spring, as you will remember, was a very unfavorable one for getting the ordinary road work performed, the roads not being fit for work until after the time for working upon the land.

Falconwood. The expenditure at Falconwood Hospital has exceeded the estimates somewhat. There were some unusual expenditures, which could not be anticipated. One that I might mention was a new heating boiler for the infirmary.

so we were compelled to delay the permanent rebuilding and to let it stand over until this year, only temporary repairs being effected. Apart from that, there is not anything special to note in connection with Falconwood institution.

Interest Charges. I now come to the matter of interest. The interest is larger this year than last, and I am sure my hon. friend will take advantage of that any day. You must have increased the liabilities.

With regard to short loans, I have before explained the nature of the interest on these loans. The member is quite familiar with the matter. A short loan consists of deposits made by our people just as they would place deposits in our banks on interest bearing account.
