...Fred. Mallett of McLellan Bros., Charlottetown, went to the Magdalen Islands last week on a business trip.

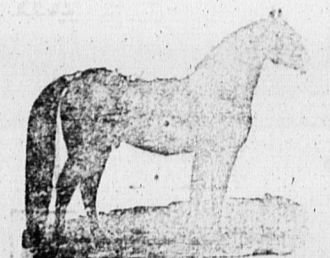
...Miss Annie Cavanagh, Earncliffe, is spending a pleasant holiday with her cousin, Mrs. Daniel Stewart, New Perth West.

...The death occurred at Gowan Brae on Monday, June 27th, in her 62nd year, of Mrs. Flora Hickey, wife of the late C. A. Hickey, after a lingering illness of three years' duration. Her remains were conveyed by train from Souris to Indian River, where she was buried in the R. C. Cemetery, there to await the final resurrection. She leaves to mourn three sons and one daughter, all at home.

...The funeral took place Sunday afternoon, Miss Mamie Moynagh from her home, Souris, to St. Mary's R. C. Church, thence to R. C. Cemetery, Rev. R. B. McDonald officiating at the service. Her funeral was very largely attended, being the largest ever in Souris for a long time. Miss Moynagh was a very popular young lady and last fall went to Boston for a change. Having improved in health, she left for home, accompanied by her brother, Edward. After arriving in Charlottetown Saturday evening she was suddenly taken ill and could not be removed to her home in Souris. Her mother left for Charlottetown Monday morning to nurse her and despite all that medical skill and her mother's nursing could do, she passed peacefully away Thursday evening, June 30th, at the Pearson House, city. Her remains were conveyed to Souris by train Friday morning. The pall-bearers were: W. D. Currie, Neil McIsaac, Frank Steina, Augustus McDonald, William Tierney, Wesley Mellet.
