SUNK BY GERMAN RAIDER.

BALTIMORE, Sept. 15.— News of the sinking of the British steamship Gramplan Range by a German sea raider a few weeks ago in the Atlantic was brought to port today by the captain of a vessel who talked with one of the survivors. The Gramplan Range was trailed by the raider for 36 hours before the German commander thought the time opportune to send her to the bottom.

During the time the raider followed the freighter those on board were congratulating themselves on having company through the "barred zone," thinking the vessel was an allied merchantman. At the end of the 36 hours those on the freighter were dumbfounded when their escort ran up a signal to the masthead which read: "Stop, or I will open fire."

At the same moment several false ports and deck superstructures were swung back, showing a formidable array of heavy guns. The life boats of the Gramplan Range were soon in the water and while the members of the crew were being taken prisoners aboard the raider, some of the Germans placed bombs aboard the freighter.

After they had been on the raider for several days the men from the Gramplan Range learned the reason the raider did not sink her upon sight was because they were also after another vessel in the vicinity and did not want to arouse the suspicion of her captain by gunfire. The Gramplan Range was one of the newer vessels of the Furness-Withy Line.

BERLIN CLAIMS VICTORY OVER FRENCH FORCES

BERLIN, Sept. 14.— (via London.)—German "shock" troops yesterday penetrated as far as the second French line west of Guignicourt on the Aisne front, and inflicted heavy losses on the defenders, according to the official statement issued today by the German war office.

In Flanders the artillery battle increased to drum fire, the announcement adds, but no engagements of infantry developed.

The German general staff reports that on the night of September 12-13 the British were driven from the wooden section north of Langemark on the Belgian front, and that numerous prisoners were taken.

FOUND LEAD CAPS IN SHIPMENT OF NAILS.

NEW YORK, Sept. 14.— Accidental discovery that wire nails in a consignment of Sweden were covered with lead caps caused the customs authorities today to hold up a shipment of 300 cases of the nails. The smashing of one of the cases by a passing truck on a Brooklyn pier led to the discovery. It was said there was enough lead on each nail for the manufacture of a rifle bullet, and that the application for shipping license contained no mention of the lead, simply stating that the cases contained wire nails.

The cases have been standing on a dock for about three weeks. The investigation will seek to determine whether the lead was placed on the nails as a subterfuge to get needed war material to Germany or whether it was there for some legitimate purpose. The lead caps are described as fitting loosely and easily removable.

ENTENTE CONFERENCE HAS BEEN POSTPONED.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 14.— The projected entente military conference which was scheduled to be held in Paris this month has been postponed until October. Advice to this effect reached Washington today through diplomatic channels. The cause assigned for the delay is that the approaching winter lessens the necessity for holding the conference at the present time, and that a postponement will furnish a larger opportunity for the war offices of the entente powers to assemble data and consider plans for minor operations to be conducted during the winter, and for big drives to be undertaken next spring.

During the past two weeks interally naval conferences have been in progress in Paris for the discussion of the shipping problem and various aspects of the U-boats campaign. All the entente allies are making a careful canvass of the world's available tonnage, neutral and belligerent, and this information will be utilized in the consideration of future war plans during the coming conferences. It is expected that Japan will be persuaded to allot a considerable portion of the Japanese merchant tonnage for entente and American uses, and that this can be arranged by the United States Government, which is in a position to compensate Japanese owners for the ships to be transferred from the Pacific to trans-Atlantic trade routes.



home today. It was in June, 1916, during the hard battle of Ypres, that Vaughan was taken prisoner after he had received a shrapnel wound in the arm.

With this regiment, 900 strong, he went into action. Only seventy-five returned, the remainder were either killed or taken prisoner. Of Vaughan's platoon only three remained alive.

After a few months in Dulmen, Westphalia, Vaughan, with a number of other prisoners, was quartered in an old theatre. On every six days each man received a loaf of bread. On one occasion, one of the men found a dog's leg in soup.

Vaughan and a chum named a Potter from Winnipeg, managed to secure a saw and cut a hole into the quarters of some deported Belgians. They had a railway map and obtained a compass. The night they escaped their fellow prisoners set up a tremendous chatter of conversation and song and distracted the attention of the guard. The two Canadians got into the Belgian quarters, where they were given caps and clothes. Disguised as Belgians, they started their tramp to the border. They had to walk miles, even when the line was reached, on account of the electrified wire, but finally crawled into Holland one misty evening between two sentries and clothes. Disguised as Belgians, only a few yards away.
