The death occurred at O'Leary recently, of Mary Dunn aged 68, relict of the late Chas. Dunn. She was a daughter of the late Andrew Hughes of Freetown, and was born in the county Monaghan, Ireland, and emigrated to the Island in the "Margaret Pollock" in 1841. Of the 40 infants who took passage on the steamer, she was the only one who survived the voyage.

It is not known how badly she is damaged but a diver, who is aboard, will go down and examine. The shock displaced her boiler and she shook the ventilators of the top of the house. It is expected that she will have to return to Pictou, to go on the slip.

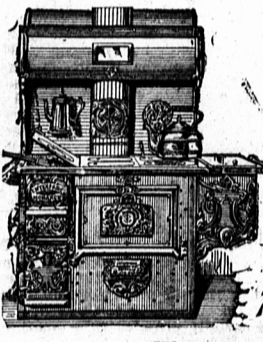

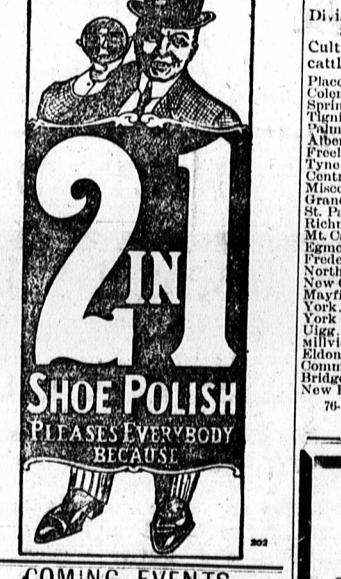
