DIED.

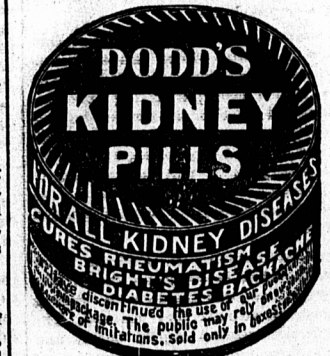
