## THE PROHIBITORY LAW.

The frank and outspoken statement of Premier Farquharson on Wednesday evening in regard to the Prohibitory Law deserves the hearty commendation of the temperance people throughout the Island. Having passed the law the Government will stand by it and see that it is carried into effect. This has been hoped and expected with confidence, but none the less the assurance of the Premier given in connection with an amendment intended to make the law more secure, is most gratifying. We doubt not also that it will be found to be "good politics". There can be no compromise between the prohibitionists and the liquor trade. One or the other of the two parties must have their way, and there can be no question that the great majority of the people of the Island desire to see the traffic entirely abolished.

As Mr. Farquharson says, the liquor sellers have had their day. They have had a law very much to their own liking and the results are what we have seen. They have had a year's notice of the new order of things that is to come into effect on the 5th of June. This has given them ample time to close out their stocks and to prepare for earning a livelihood in honest and reputable callings. They have nothing to complain of in that regard. Their clear duty is to quit the liquor business and obey the law. We trust and believe that many of them will do so. Any that choose the contrary course will be open to the charge of deliberately defying the law of the land and can receive no honest sympathy when the penalties are enforced against them.

It is probable, unfortunately, that the law will be violated, as all prohibitory and restrictive laws have been. Very probably, too, some of the earlier cases may be appealed and carried from court to court. Like unruly farm stock enclosed within a fence, there will be some who will eagerly seek for a weak place that may be broken through, or a hole through which they may crawl. The duty of the Government and the friends of the law will be to keep watch, from time to time to strengthen the weak places, if any, in the law, and to punish those who break it. Upon this point the statement of the Premier is satisfactory, showing that the Government recognises its responsibility, and that the prosecution of violators will not stop simply because a convicted violator has sought to have the conviction quashed.

It was perhaps to be expected that in a House of thirty members there would be found one or more trimmers, who with strong professions of a desire for prohibition evince a desire to curry favor with the liquor sellers. Our Legislature forms no exception to other similar bodies in that regard. But the clearly defined position of the Government as stated by the Premier, and we may add, by the Attorney General also, to stand by the law, and to uphold and enforce it. This is commendable mainly on the ground of right, and if honestly carried into effect it will be found that in this instance the path of duty is also the road to solid and enduring popularity.

A number of Anglican Prelates, including the Bishops of Ripon, Colchester, and London are said to be devoted wheelmen.

President Whitney of the Dominion Coal Company says that next month the Company will be turning out at Sydney 12,000 tons of coal a day, or at the rate of 3,750,000 tons a year.

Manitoba Legislators still receive \$300 each per session notwithstanding the announced intention of the Conservative Government of that Province to reduce the indemnity to \$100 each. The cases are rare in which members voluntarily reduce their rate of pay.

F. P. Dunne, the author of the Dooley Papers, who has been invalided abroad for some months, announces from Rome that his health is restored and he will sail shortly for the United States to resume work. No doubt his friend Hennessey, will be the foremost to welcome the return of Dooley.

The Dead Sea surface is some 1312 feet below the level of the ocean. Nearly the entire valley of the Jordan is also below the sea level. Recently it has been observed that the Dead Sea is rising and the causes speculation concerning the possibility that some subterranean connection has been formed between the inland sea and the ocean. Should this prove to be the case the valley of the Jordan and many of the sacred and historic parts of Palestine may yet be submerged.

Mr. Whitney, President of the Dominion Iron and Steel Company, whose works are nearing completion at Sydney, says that by August they will be turning out 1,000 tons of steel per day, or at the rate of 313,000 tons a year. The steel rail plant material is all on the ground and they hope to be making steel rails early in October next. If the company put their entire contemplated output into steel rails it would be sufficient to supply eight miles of railway per day with 70 lb rails, or 2,400 miles in a year of 313 working days.

In a biographical sketch of the late Judge Robie of Nova Scotia, contributed to Academics by Israel Longworth, the interesting fact is pointed out that Nova Scotia led the way in the matter of Catholic emancipation. By resolution passed on 3rd April, 1823, Lawrence Kavanagh, the first Roman Catholic member, was admitted to the Legislature as a representative of Cape Breton without taking the oaths against Popery and transubstantiation. This was five years before O'Connell was first elected to the British House of Commons as member for Clare and was not permitted to take his seat. At a later date the liberal action of the Nova Scotia Legislature led Mr. O'Connell to make the acquaintance of Joseph Howe at a social party in England, introducing himself and giving Mr. Howe a hearty shake of the hand, because he came from "the British Colony that was the first to settle the question of Catholic emancipation."
