Sub-section (d) of Section 13 of the Act respecting dogs, reads as follows: "Any person not paying the tax as provided in the preceding sub-sections shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten dollars and in default to be imprisoned for a period not exceeding ten days."

Emperor Hirohito plans for "second steps" to deal with Japan's steadily widening conflict with China.

An official announcement said that in view of "the utmost gravity" of the situation in North China, General Gen Sugiyama, war minister, and Admiral Mitsumasa Yonai, navy minister, will make a full report tomorrow morning to a secret joint session of the two chambers of parliament.

The Premier, in Parliament, said the Government might have to ask "further cooperation of the Japanese people" in dealing with the undeclared war in North China. He said, however, that hope for a peaceful settlement had not been abandoned.
