# BRAVE CANADIANS HELD THEIR GROUND

Mrs. James F. McLeod, Bradbane has received the following letter from her son John J., now in France with the 102nd Batt. France, Aug. 23, 1917. Dear Mother,— You must be wondering why I have not answered some of your letters before. Well, for the last month I've been so busy I did not get a chance to write anybody and besides we were for 27 days so situated that you could not get a chance to write, if you had the time, I suppose you see by the papers where the Canadians are now, needless to say, we have been in the thick of it all, and I am proud to say that our Battalion kept up the record. she won on the Somme and at Vimy. It is nicknamed "The fighting 102nd," and believe me, it is second to none in the British Army. I have been lucky so far, to get off without a scratch, although I had a narrow escape about a week ago; a shell killed one of my comrades and wounded another that was standing beside me. The concussion knocked me down but except for a shaking up I was unhurt. Now mother, I do not want you to worry about me. I consider myself lucky that at last I have become well and strong enough to help do my bit. The weather is pretty fine now but one does not appreciate it much here. It is so different here from England. I think of all places I have been I would rather England than any. Of course it is not much around the camps, but in some places I've been to, it has no equal. I shall never forget the kindness of the people to me and all of us, while in the Hospital; there, I had a letter from Dan MacLean some time ago, but like a mutt I lost his address. Dan is a fine fellow I hope he gets back all right. It must be nice on P. E. I. now, I only hope that "Fritz" looks for peace soon, so we can all be home together again. I must close as I've written quite a long letter this time. Write as soon as you get this, for it is certainly fine to get a scrap of news from home it breaks the monotony of war. I am always so glad, mother dear to get one of your letters for although Mae and Rae usually have more news, yet there seems sometimes lacking if you have not written a few lines. Tell Dad I will write to him next time, hope he is getting his health this summer. Will say good bye for this time, with love to all from JOHNNY.

# GLASS BOTTOM BOATS TO HUNT SUBMARINES.

PITTSBURG, Sept. 14.—After refusing to accept a \$4,000,000 shrapnel order at the beginning of the European conflict from the British Government because of humanitarian reasons, Charles R. Bryson, president of the Electric Steel Company has placed his patriotism above his conscientious beliefs and is now aiding Uncle Sam in seeking a solution for the German submarine menace. He has submitted plans to the Government of his "glass bottom" patrol boats which he declares can be used as a means to rid the sea of the U-boat, mines and other unseen perils to navigation. It has been suggested to the Government by Mr. Bryson to build surface patrol boats with glass bottoms, which are to be equipped with powerful reflectors, that would be able to penetrate the water to a depth of 500 feet. In this manner it would be able to locate sunken mines. His plans also call for the equipping of the patrol boats with shall torpedoes which could be used to attack the undersea boats.

# W. A. WILLISTON GOES TO THE FRONT IN PLACE OF STEWART LYON

OTTAWA, Sept. 18.—Walter A. Williston has been named as the representative of the Canadian Press, Limited, with the Canadian Army in France. Mr. Williston succeeds Stewart Lyon, of the Toronto Globe, who returns to Canada after six months' meritorious service. Mr. Williston was the representative of the Toronto News in London for two and a half years, visited the British, French and Canadian men on many occasions, and is familiar with conditions in the zone of hostilities. He returned to Canada some time ago and since the organization of the food controller's office in Ottawa has been in charge of the publicity work for that body.

# SWEDEN FORCED INTO WAR.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—The Tribune to-day publishes the following despatch from Woodstock, N. Y. "Sweden may be forced into the war on the side of the Allies, as a result of exposure by the United States government of the complicity of the Swedish foreign office in German spy machinations, is the opinion of Edwin Bjorkman, writer and translator of Scandinavian literature, just returned from Stockholm to his home here." Mr. Bjorkman sees trouble ahead for Sweden, of which he is a native, including the bureaucracy, which has ruled the country for hundreds of years and forcing the abdication of King Gustave and his German Queen, a cousin of the Kaiser.

# THE QUEBEC BRIDGE

QUEBEC, Sept. 18.—Lifting operations in connection with the placing of the central span of the Quebec bridge in its final position linking up the two cantilever arms were recommenced this morning. Yesterday's successful operations and the continuance of the ideal weather for the work gave the engineers hope that the end of to-day would see the span within only fifty-eight feet of the floor of the bridge. They expected to elevate the span, sixty-eight feet yesterday a raise of twenty-eight feet was made. Owing to the late start yesterday, the highest tide was missed and the span has 152 feet to travel, two feet more than expected. The early hoists this morning showed that the engineers were able to make better time than yesterday. The average time taken yesterday to lift each link of the chains holding the span was 18 minutes. The men took fifteen for the first link taken up this morning.
