VISIT FROM WINTER BIRD.—Lovers of nature might be interested to know that the Bohemian Waxwing was seen in town on Saturday last, the 11th Dec. This is an Arctic bird, not very common on the island and only seen in winter. The bird is larger than the Cedar Waxwing, or Cedar Bird, which comes from the south and remains during the summer. It is greyish brown in colour with white and yellow marking on the wing and yellow on the tip of the tail. These birds are unique in having a curious wax-like growth on the tips of some of the strong feathers of the wings and rarely on the tail. Watch for the bird. They are seen on Pownal Street, frequently on mountain, very noisy. Needless to say, they should not be molested.

WOUNDED, BUT GLAD HE ENLISTED.—George Mooney, a private in the Canadian Expeditionary Force, writes a most interesting letter to Mr. James Mooney, Houlton (Me.) Private Mooney was a seaman when the war broke out. He was born in Charlottetown (P. E. I.) and for five years lived at Woodstock. His letter follows: "I would let you know that I am getting along all right. My knee doesn't bother me any to speak of. I have been up for days now but it is still a little sore when I walk much. I could be in hospital yet but I got tired of it and I would not stay in bed. They tried to keep me on my back all the time so I got up. The nurse told me I wasn't supposed to get up. I told her I was tired lying there, so she went for the doctor. He tried to put me back. I said: 'Who owns this leg, me or you?' He said 'You are like a lot more Canadians I know.' He told me I would be better in bed for a week or two. But I want to be on deck when Kaiser Bill checks in. Well, it is much better here than at Loos. That advance was a holy fright. I thought I was going to get mine every minute. But the scratch I got was nothing, especially when it was below the belt. We were supports to the Y. L. X. and the Northern Lads. It only lasted an hour and a half in the company of Y. L. X., they lost 124 men killed, and the Northern Lads lost heavily too. Our company was away making guns on the place and when we went to get over we got it heavy then. The machine guns kept up a steady fire. Some of the Lads got over the German parapet but they had to get back again as the bullets were as thick as mosquitoes. It was a German stronghold. In one place we drove them back but we could not hold them there. There were too many for us. Well, Tom, I am glad to hear the Canadians are going so well. I am glad I enlisted to do my bit. I am having an extra good time and have a lot of good friends here. They certainly use us Canadians white."
