THE TRUSTS AND THE QUACKS.

On all sides, the trust doctors are busy working up and offering their remedies. Among them is the usual proposition of quacks. If the patient were handed over to them for a kind of composite treatment, we should soon be attending the funeral of business in America. Meanwhile, there are real developments. How far the law fails to satisfy the country as a whole is clear from the fact that it is still more or less in the twilight zone of judicial interpretation after 20 years of existence, that its criminal penalties have never been successfully applied and are even now under constitutional attack, and that nearly all political parties and leaders propose amendments or the enactment of a new law. Fundamentally, there are two main decisions of public opinion—one aiming at the utter destruction of the trusts and the restoration of old-time conditions of competition in industry; the other aiming at the frank acceptance of the economic principle of combination in industry, under government regulation. So far as we can form an opinion from some observation of the current discussion, the former school is gradually losing ground among those disinterested people of intelligence whose views will ultimately prevail. The feeling is gaining strength that big business has come to stay and that the sensible thing to do is to place it under such direction and restraint, through the exercise of governmental authority, that it will promote the public welfare rather than develop oppressive monopolies, pile up private fortunes gained by anti-social methods and arouse popular passions and class wars.—Springfield Republican (ind.)

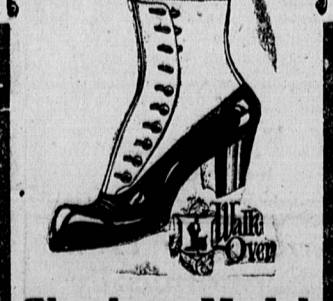
