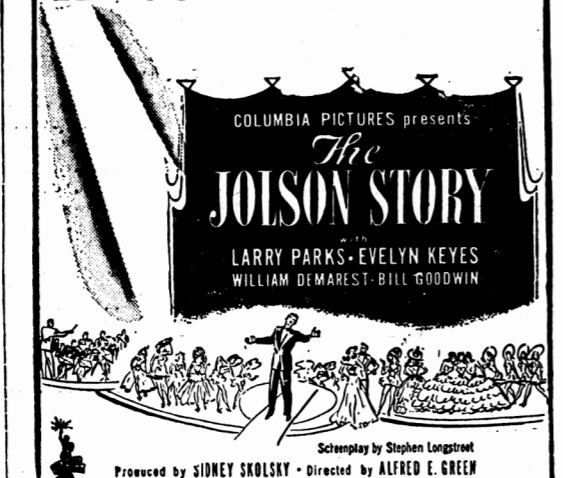

MEETING COOPERATIVE

(Continued from Page 5) the co-operatives of Canada had shown sufficient initiative to bring about fair and equitable laws in this regard and to convince the Government that the movement was strong, viable and powerful because the common people were behind it in its aims.

He referred to the activities of the Income Tax Payers Association which he said was originated and financed by big business interests who were opposed to the co-operative movement because it was cutting across their path of big business.

Before adjourning the afternoon session the election of two directors to fill the vacancies made by retiring directors was held and Mr. Jerome O'Brien of Montreal was re-elected to represent the Consumers Cooperative. Mr. Louis O'Connor of Kensington was elected to replace Mr. Melvin Bridges representing Producers Cooperative.

The directors met after the evening recess at 8 p. m. and at this meeting Mr. Jerome O'Brien was re-elected president, Mr. Louis O'Connor, vice-president and Mr. J. G. Dennis was again re-elected as secretary for the coming year.

Evening Session "We are the victims of stereotyped thinking, forced on us by old fashioned capitalist propaganda," the audience were told last night at the open meeting in connection with the convention of the P. E. I. Cooperative Union by Rev. Adolphus Gillis of Edmonton, Alta.

The meeting was held in St. Paul's Hall, Summerside and was presided over by Rev. M. E. Francis of the Extension Department of St. Dunstan's University.

Father Gillis, who is formerly from St. Peter's Bay and an ex-chaplain, began his talk by explaining the agriculture of Alberta. He said that "the big thing we have to do today is change our thinking. We must change our approach to many problems, be courageous and ready to experiment and try out new ideas." He admitted that some of these ideas will turn out to be wrong but a lot of the old ones have been wrong too, he said.

Mr. A. B. MacDonald, general secretary of the Cooperative Union of Canada, Ottawa, also addressed the meeting. He said that the first job to be done in order to have a happy and contented people is to transfer the ownership of the natural resources to the people. They should own the fish plants, lobster factories, seals, land etc. He stressed that in order to forward the cooperative movement the young people must be brought into it. To give direction to the young people we must arouse ourselves and have a missionary spirit, he said.

Dr. M. M. Coody, head of the Extension Dept. of St. Francis Xavier University, Antigonish, also spoke briefly and will address a public meeting in St. Paul's hall tonight.
