DISTRICT S. S. CONVENTION
 North West Queens Sunday Schools Meet
 at Brookfield.
 The fifth convention of the North West
 Queens Sunday School Association opened
 with a devotional meeting led by
 Robert Andrews.
 Rev. George Millar, the President pre-
 sided. It was found necessary to appoint
 a Secretary pro tem in absence of the
 presence of Miss Margaret Ross; and on mo-
 tion of Rev. George Millar, J. S. Clark
 was appointed to the position. A Com-
 mittee was appointed to decide place and
 time of next convention of which Rev.
 George Millar was chairman with George
 Mallett, John Waye and Daniel McDonald
 as associates.
 The Roll of Sunday Schools was called
 by the acting secretary, delegates rising
 in their places and one reporting to the
 meeting. Reports proved cheering, as
 seven schools are now open during the
 winter for the first time in their history,
 while others are advancing in various
 ways.
 After the matter of registration and re-
 port had been considered, our President
 called upon Rev. George Millar to deliver
 an address on "The Teacher and The
 Scholar."
 Our attention was directed to the great
 importance of having trained teachers,
 with proper tools, working according to
 recognized rules and depending upon that
 strength which is vital before any work
 can be accomplished. Teachers are em-
 phatically, materials so vitally required
 to consummate skill. The Word of
 God is the book of instructions, and
 the Holy Spirit our only source of
 strength. After his excellent paper, our
 Field Secretary conducted a Conference
 on Grading and Supplemental Work. His
 impressions of "The Importance of re-
 quiring more definite work, to be done in
 the various classes. Scholars are pro-
 moted on account of work done, and not
 merely because they wish advancement
 themselves; thus more earnest study is
 secured, and the Sunday School accom-
 plishes more of the purpose of its
 existence.
 The evening session opened with sing-
 ing, scripture reading and prayer offered
 by D. McDonald and J. Waye, then after
 singing, prayer again led by J. S. Clark
 and Mr. Beaton. The choir sang "Where
 He leads me I will follow," then Rev.
 George Millar announced his regret that
 two of the speakers for the evening were
 absent. He spoke very earnestly on the
 relation of the teacher to his Bible and the
 Holy Spirit.
 "Count your Blessings" was sung by the
 choir and a Blackboard Address by the
 Field Secretary followed.
 Mr. Raymond first briefly outlined
 the work of the S. S. Association
 throughout the Province, especially
 calling attention to the recent move-
 ment in placing a set of books in each
 County for Primary Sunday School work-
 ers. He announced that Miss Jeanette
 McLeod of Hunter River had charge of
 the books for Queen's County and any
 teacher might have the use of them by
 sending his address to Miss McLeod. Mr.
 Raymond went on to tell how help may
 be used to best advantage, blackboards,
 maps and pictures, using the blackboard
 to illustrate his teaching. He then called
 upon J. S. Clark to show how he uses the
 board in his own School. Committee re-
 ported regarding next session to be held
 the last Friday of October in the Presby-
 terian church at Hartsville. The choir
 rendered a selection, the offering was
 taken which amounted to \$4.57 besides
 some individual pledges and the Con-
 vention adjourned after singing a parting
 hymn, and prayer by Field Secy.
