

The Actual Mobilization

In accordance with the organization already described, each purchaser had in his despatch box a list of stables, containing horses fit for military purposes at the last census and from which they might take 50 per cent. of the total numbers. Further contents included a list of units, or depots to receive units, each day, and a table showing the railway programme. Each purchaser's list contained about 40 per cent more horses than he was called on to produce. It depended therefore, on the reasonable accuracy of the census whether or not the required number of horses was forthcoming. The annual census was the groundwork of the mobilization on which the remount department had been working almost day and night for the past two years, but it was not possible to get so wide reaching a system into full working order in so short a space of time. It was, however, sufficiently forward to be able to equip the whole of the expeditionary force, with matured and suitable horses, while over 60,000 horses of various values were issued to the territorial force. The organization, young, and newly-organized as it was, succeeded in putting the total number of horses required into their places with the units wanting them by the dates which the War Council had laid down as necessary for the despatch of the expeditionary force and the defence of the country by the territorial forces.

134,000 Horses in Twelve Days

Reviewing the situation generally the remount directorate of the War Office presided over by Major General Birkbeck, and its officers distributed over the country, may congratulate themselves on having placed 26,000 magnificent horses in the ranks of the expeditionary force, 80,000 useful horses for the territorial force, and 18,000 horses for the reserve formations within twelve days of the order to mobilize. It should also be realized how much the competent control of the railway authorities contributed to the distribution of the horses to the units requiring them. Since the completion of mobilization the large improvements to the British forces and the large demands to replace the natural wastage due to extremely arduous operations have been successfully met during the last three months from the resources in the United Kingdom. Horses are still flowing to units in the field of a sample equal to that with which they were first equipped, and some 60,000 more have been purchased since mobilization was completed for drafts and new formations.

SUMMER DECKLOADS TO BE ALLOWED TO ENTER ENGLISH PORTS.

OTTAWA, January 25.—The marine department, acting in line with the British board of trade, is relaxing the summer deckloads rules for ocean going ships. The summer deckload has not been permitted in English ports until April 16th, but will now be allowed on vessels arriving after March 30th. Vessels will accordingly be allowed to leave Canadian ports for the United Kingdom with summer deckloads after March 1st in the case of steamers. The Canadian government, however, takes no responsibility in the case of a Canadian ship arriving in England before the open season.
