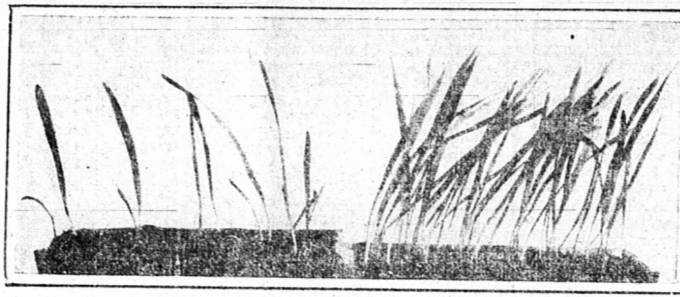
CAN THE FARMER DO IT?

That is the Great Question He Asks Re Greater Production. Thoroughly Cleaning and Testing His Seed Will Do It

"In a farmer's grain bin there are 100 bushels of oats. He wishes to use it for seed. Under average conditions thirty bushels will not grow. If fed to stock this quantity will make good feed.

What is Seed? Now, a seed does not merely mean grain, as it is often looked upon to be. That seed contains a germ, which under proper conditions, has the power to grow.

it, therefore, follows that unless the germ is strong and vigorous, and unless the food supply is sufficient to carry it over for a sufficient length of time, no plant can be formed.



The foundation of greater crop production is good seed. This shows the result in the field of sowing the oats illustrated above.

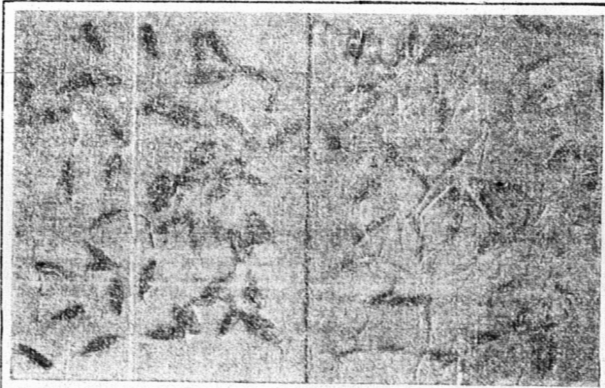

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON. April 4, 1915. SAUL REJECTED BY THE LORD. I. Sam. 15.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"Behold to obey is better than sacrifice."—I. Sam. 12:22.

Verses 1-3.—The Amalekites were a branch of the descendants of Esau (Gen. 36:12). Unlike the Edomites (the other branch of Esau's descendants), they were aggressive and persistent in their enmity against the Israelites.

Verses 4-9. Saul's campaign against the Amalekites was distinguished for three peculiarities not common to other campaigns of the same general period. In the first place, it was a war of aggression.

Verses 10-16. Saul's failure to honor the law of "devotion" was at once recognized by the Prophet Samuel as a serious delinquency. So serious, indeed, that the only way he could be sufficiently condemned was to picture God as "repenting" that he had "set up Saul to be king."

gratified by his evident unbelief about it. When Samuel came to meet him he addressed the prophet with the perfect assurance of one that had done exactly as he ought to have done. "To have performed the commandment of Jehovah." Another aggravation of the offense was the selfish motive that actuated him in preserving what was consigned to devotion. He saved "the best" of everything, and destroyed "the vile and refuse."

Verses 32-35. But before Samuel left the camp of Saul he had a further duty to perform. He completed the act of "devotion" by putting Agag to a cruel death. It is not necessary to justify this act. It was an incident in a man's life, and a view of the world which happily passed away under the influence of Christ.
