**HALF MILLION SHELDON SHARES OF OPERATIONS**

AN ILLUMINATING FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

The recapitulation of the curator's report on Sheldon's business is as follows:—

Balance as shown in ledgers to credit of clients, including so-called profits.....\$2,138,000

Amounts invested.....1,427,468

Amounts withdrawn.....971,277

Amounts paid clients, being profits.....425,908

Amounts to credit of clients, being deposits, less profits, if any.....859,883

MONTREAL, Dec. 17.—According to the official report completed today by Messrs. Wilkes and Burnett, curators of the insolvent C. D. Sheldon estate, the fugitive financier received almost a million and a half dollars in cash during his two years' stay in Montreal.

Amounts withdrawn by his clients up to the time of Sheldon's flight, totalled \$971,277, which would indicate that the vanishing promoter ran away with half a million dollars in Canadian money.

Certain losses in Sheldon's business must be accounted for, however. In carrying on small operations on the stock market he was frequently on the losing side. Taking this into consideration, along with his 10 per cent. commission to agents and his heavy office expenditure, it is calculated that he got away with at least \$300,000 in excess of what he paid out.

All Sheldon's creditors have not yet filed claims with the curators. The curators' report is based on the actual figures in their possession.

What they have seen of Sheldon's books proves more strongly than ever his loose office methods. There is no trace at all in his ledgers of scores of claimants and beneficiaries that when many people invested with him, he merely thrust the money into his trousers pocket without keep-

ing any record of it. It is well known that he always carried a wad around with him.

A pathetic appeal was discovered by the curators in searching through Sheldon's papers. It was a letter received from an old French-Canadian gentleman on October 12, just when everybody was looking for the vanished promoter. It reads as follows:—

"C. D. Sheldon:—

"Sir—I am an old man, 60 years of age, with a family to support, and all the capital that I possessed, I put into your hands with the greatest confidence in you. If I lose this amount, I will be completely ruined. Will you then kindly return me an accepted cheque for \$1,750 by next mail; that is the amount I invested with you, and I am confident that you will not make me lose this amount, because I did not withdraw a cent of profit from you."

The letter concluded with a postscript:—

"Think of me, sixty years old, and not a dollar in the world if I lose this. How will I support my family?"

Sheldon started business in Montreal in a small Hospital street office two years ago this month. He was running his so-called operations on a very small scale then. His fame gradually grew and so did his list of clients, until he moved to his larger quarters on St. James Street. At the time he ran away from Montreal early last October he had slightly over 5,500 clients, and the list had been growing daily.

**A WONDERFUL INVENTION AT THE EDEN MUSEE.**

At the Eden Musee, of New York City, from time to time during the past twenty-five years, many great inventions have made their first public appearance in this country. This has been particularly true of moving pictures. The first reproduction of the Passion Play was made at the Musee, and the Musee was the first public place to use the Phonograph, the Kinetoscope and moving pictures as attractions. For nearly a century inventors have been trying to photograph pictures in their original colors. These efforts have met with only partial success. Reproduction of moving pictures in natural colors has long been deemed impossible. Individual films have been colored by hand, but the result was far from satisfactory. The Eden Musee has at last secured a color process which reproduces upon a large screen, moving pictures in their original colors. These pictures are not colored by hand and in fact the films have no colors in them. The ingenious machine which produces the marvellous effect is called the Kinemacolor Moving Picture Machine, and the coloring is produced through the agency of light only.

Objects appear upon the screen in all the variations of their natural color. Flowers, costumes and scenery appear as wonderful oil-paintings, as lifelike that it is hard to believe the original object is not seen. One picture presented, is a trip through the Zoological Gardens in London, showing many wild animals, beautiful foliage scenes and water effects in which every color is absolutely reproduced on the screen. Another picture shows numerous scenes on the Bathing Beach at Brighton, England, in which the different shades of color in the sky, ocean and bathing costumes are most wonderful. Other objects are equally well produced and visitors can easily determine that the seemingly impossible color problem has been perfectly accomplished. These pictures are shown hourly after-noon and evening, and include many other scenes in black and white subjects of most unusual interest. There are many other attractions at the Musee, including the marvellous collection of wax groups and figures, interesting novelties, and afternoon and evening concerts.

TORONTO, Dec. 16.—"Wars are not paid for in war-time, the bill comes later," with these words of Benjamin Franklin, Dr. David Starr Jordan, president of Leland Stanford University, Palo Alto, California, concluded a powerful address yesterday on the subject of "War and Manhood," before the Canadian Club, in which he said:

"I do not believe there is any more danger of war between England and Germany than between England and Mars. One reason is that England is too wise and sensible to begin war wantonly, another reason is that Germany, though not too wise and sensible, is too clever to make war wantonly. Beyond all this the system of credit would be broken up and the invisible empire that stands behind the powers that appear to be the powers does not want war."

**Public Notice**

As measles seem to be getting prevalent in the schools of Charlottetown owing to the neglect of some citizens, public notice is called to the Regulations of the Board of Health, especially to Rules 1 and 6.

Rule 1 states that any householder in whose house occurs a case of measles shall immediately notify the Board of Health, through its Health Officer or secretary, of the same.

Rule 6 states that no member of any household where measles exists shall be permitted to mingle with children in schools, churches, or other public places.

There is a penalty of \$40.00 for failure to obey the rules.

The Board of Health requests all citizens to comply with the regulations at once, and assist in stamping out the disease.
