PECULIAR SYSTEM OF TRADE MARK

Prevails in Argentine—The British Consul Sends Out Warning

OTTAWA, Sept. 27—Canadians doing business with the Argentine will be interested in learning the value of a registered trade mark in that country. A despatch from the Colonial Secretary states that the British Consul at Buenos Ayres reports anyone can register any trade mark on any class or any number of classes of goods provided they are not already registered. A person can lay an embargo on goods entering the country bearing a trade mark he has registered, though he may be the owner of the mark in his own country. An instance is given of a Canadian firm which has been selling some years under a certain trade mark, now finds that it may not import its own goods into the Argentine under that mark because it has been registered by a firm of importers in Buenos Ayres. There is nothing for the Canadian firm to do but buy the mark. It costs \$50 to register a mark in Montreal.

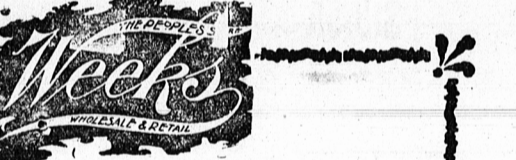
