(Special to The Guardian.) PITTSBURGH, Oct. 5.—Clues that may lead to the Wall Street bombers were believed unearthed here today by disclosures of Florean Zelenka, a bomb suspect held here. Zelenka was arrested here with five sticks of dynamite in his possession. He told the investigators he purchased the explosives in a mining company store and after quitting his job as miner, retained the sticks to use on another job.
