GERMAN'S PLAN FOR INVASION OF ENGLAND

Tells Audience How Island Could be Captured by Fleet of 10,000 Airships.

BERLIN, Oct. 28. — Herr Rudolf Martin, government councillor and author of "The Coming War in the Air," who is president of the recently formed German League for Motor-Airship Navigation, fired the imagination of his hearers at a public meeting in Berlin recently with a plan for the conquest of England by airships.

He asserted that the principal duty of aerial navigators was to induce the combined continental powers to construct a fleet of 10,000 "Zeppelins" each to carry twenty soldiers, which should land and capture the sleeping Britons before they would realize what was taking place.

Herr Martin disposed of the British fleet by predicting that they would turn tail and leave the aerial armada home in view. In order to avoid being blown up by the shells which would otherwise be dropped on them from the clouds. The aerial armada would assemble at leisure at points opposite the English coast and begin their death-dealing voyage as soon as the weather was favorable.

Herr Martin thought that artillery and cavalry could be landed in England quite as easily as 200,000 infantry. Before he finished his alluring sketch of Great Britain's fall his audience was rocking with excitement, but not altogether at the expense of England.

KAISER'S FOURTH SON MARRIED.

BERLIN, Oct. 28. — Duchess Alexandra Victoria of Schleswig-Holstein, daughter of Prince Frederick, Duke of Schleswig-Holstein, was recently married in the chapel of the Imperial Palace to Prince August Wilhelm of Prussia, fourth son of Emperor William.

The ceremony was witnessed by the members of the Imperial family and some fifty princess and princesses of the minor German Royal houses. The Chancellor of the Empire, Prince Von Buelow, as well as the other high state functionaries, the members of the diplomatic corps with their wives, together with about 800 guests were also present. The civil ceremony was held in the private apartment of the palace, after which the empress placed the Hohenzollern crown upon the head of the young princess. The royal party marched in procession to the chapel where the ceremony of the Lutheran Church was performed. After the ceremony the royal party marched to the White Hall of the palace and held a reception to some 2,000 invited guests.

Prince August Wilhelm is 22 years old and a lieutenant in a regiment of foot guards. His bride is three months his junior.

AIRSHIP ASCENDED WITH PRINCE ON BOARD

FREDERICHSHAFFEN, Oct. 28. — Count Zeppelin's airship made an ascension this morning with Prince Henry of Prussia and Capt. Michels as passengers. The airship started in the direction of Ueberlingen, to the northward of Lake Constance.

RUN OVER BY ENGINE PICKED UP UNHURT

TORONTO, Oct. 28. — "I am tired of life, and that's why I did it." This was the explanation of William Laidlaw, a young Scotchman, 30 years of age, when he was picked up near Don on the G. T. R. tracks this morning. Laidlaw had been out of employment and deliberately threw himself in front of a shunting engine in charge of Engineer Walter C. Farrance, as it was speeding along. Yardmen on the running-board, when they saw Laidlaw, had the engine stopped, supposing the man had been run over while asleep on the rails. The engine passed over Laidlaw, but he was not injured in any way. His clothing, however, was torn off. He was removed to Wilton Avenue Police Station and charged with attempting suicide.

DEATH ROLL IS EIGHT AND LOSS A MILLION

MANILA, Oct. 28. — Official despatches received from the Sections visited by the typhoon recently place the death roll at 8 and the damage of property at a million. There were no reports of damage in Iloilo Province.

MAN DIES IN BLIZZARD TRAINS IN SNOW A WEEK

MEDICINE HAT, Sask., Oct. 28. — Held up since Monday of last week, it was not until Saturday morning that trains arrived from the east.

From the prairies comes stories of hardship and peril. Saturday evening Mitchell reported to the mounted police the death of Donald Cameron in Cypress Hills.

Cameron and Donald Fisher, shepherds in the employ of Alex. Shaw, were forced by the blizzard to leave their flocks. Cameron became exhausted and Fraser helped, carrying him fifteen hours seeking their camp. Cameron bade Fisher leave him, but when he could carry Cameron no longer, Fisher remained until Cameron passed away. Then pushing on alone, finally struck "D. D. B." ranch, after being sixteen hours without rest or nourishment. A searching party recovered the body Thursday afternoon. It is feared that many other herders perished. Some 3000 sheep drifted into Many Islands Lake, and only 300 were saved.

BUILT STEAM ENGINE FIRST BOAT.

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 28. — Otis Guthrie, one of the oldest and most interesting of Chicago's pioneers, died recently in his 72nd year. In his twentieth, Mr. Guthrie constructed the steam engine that propelled the first tug on the Chicago River. He was also known for his geological researches, having contended that the site of Chicago was in a glacial period eight thousand years ago. He was a grandson of Dr. Samuel Guthrie of Jefferson County, N. Y., the discoverer of chloroform and percussion priming powder.
