Slovaks Elect Initial Diet

BRATISLAVA, Czechoslovakia, Dec. 18—The first election under Czechoslovakia's new government of centralized power was held today when Slovaks chose their initial provincial diet.

Only one list of candidates, those of the Slovak People's Party founded by the late autonomy leader, Father Andrej Hlinka, was permitted. Dr. Joseph Tiso, who on Dec. 1 was named premier and minister of the interior for Slovak territories, headed the ticket.

There were some Germans and Hungarians among the candidates, but no Czechs or Jews, of whom several hundred thousand live in Slovakia.

Three ballot boxes were used at many polling places, one for Slovaks, Germans and Hungarians; another for Czechs and a third for Jews.

The election resembled closely those of the Fascist states. Slovak officials announced tonight that returns available gave the single list a "yes" vote of 90 per cent. Between 80 and 85 per cent of eligible voters were reported to have gone to the polls.

This heavy vote, according to leaders of the People's Party means that "the Slovak people and all national minorities in Slovakia approved the creation of a Slovak state in the federal republic of Czechoslovakia."

Warning Issued

PRAGUE, Dec. 18—The Czechoslovak Government today promised investigation of "certain groups and organizations" whose activities Poland has declared threaten to endanger relations between Warsaw and Prague.

The warning, delivered Saturday by the Polish charge d'affaires there, apparently referred to those nationalists in the Carpathian Ukraine who are conducting a campaign for a "greater Ukraine" which would include a large part of Poland.

CIESZYN, Poland, Dec. 18—Authorities here today moved to curb a renewal of anti-Polish agitation in this region ceded by Czechoslovakia to Poland.

At Karwina, in the Diessyn area, police arrested a student who was carrying by hand and distributing anti-Polish pamphlets in the Czech language. At Borunin a bomb was thrown into the apartment of a man who had proclaimed the Polish troops when they entered to occupy the town.

Premier Receives Congratulations On 24th Birthday

OTTAWA, Dec. 18—Laurier House, the Ottawa home of Prime Minister Mackenzie King, Saturday took on the appearance of a conservatory with living rooms banked with flowers which came from his friends in token of their congratulations on his 64th birthday.

Outstanding among the floral gifts was a bouquet of 64 red roses, one for each of his years, from the Prime Minister's Cabinet colleagues.

Another bouquet of roses was from the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League of which the Prime Minister is a life member.

Letter carriers and telegraph messengers brought a flood of congratulations from Canada, United States and abroad. These included good wishes from leaders of provincial Governments, heads of Liberal organizations, legations of foreign countries and from the Parliamentary Press Gallery.

Mr. Mackenzie King said he was deeply touched by the expressions of goodwill and friendship which came to him from all parts of the world. He expressed the hope those who had sent greetings would realize how impossible it was for him to acknowledge them all personally at once.

Walters And Wife Arrive In Boston

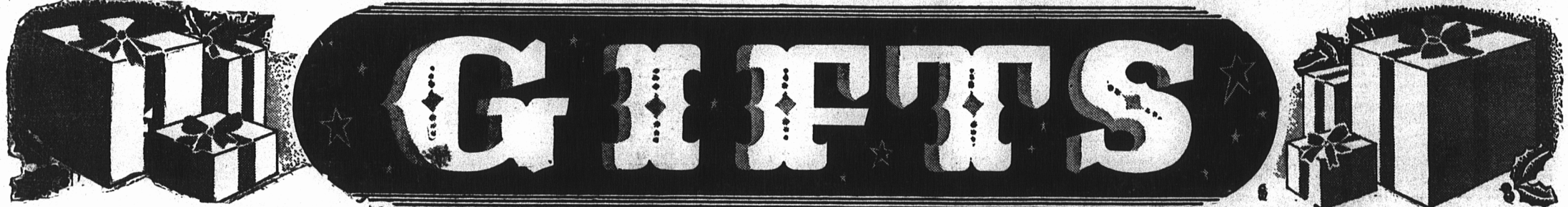

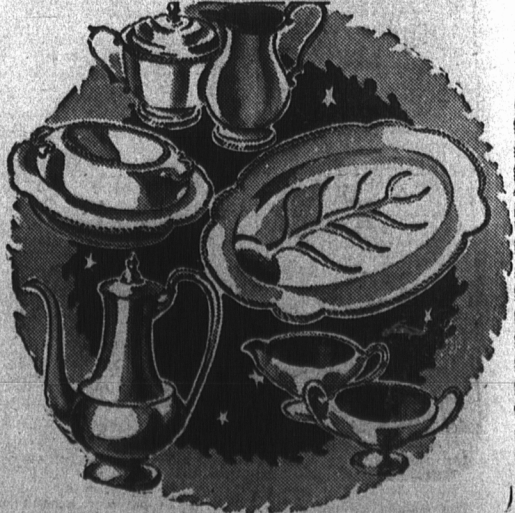
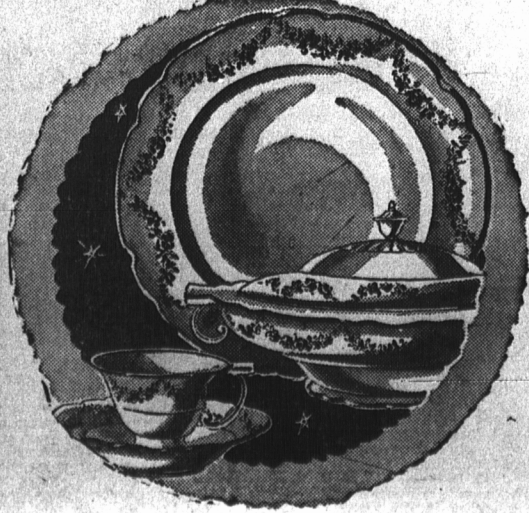
