MEDDLING BANNED BY HERTZOG

Warns About Overseas Interference in South African Native Affairs.

JOHANNESBURG, Dec. 16. — Premier J. B. M. Hertzog's speech at a banquet here last night, when he gave warning against any attempts from overseas to interfere in South Africa's native affairs and said if the interference did not cease it might one day cost the British Empire the greater part of what was today included in the Union of South Africa, was heightened in importance by the fact that several prominent men were present. These included Hon. F. W. Beyers, Minister of Mines and Industries; Hon. N. C. Havenga, Minister of Finance, former administrator of South West Africa, and Hon. G. B. Hofmeyr, a member of the Angola-South West Africa Boundary Commission, all of whom are distinguished residents of Johannesburg.

The premier's speech immediately focused the limelight in one of the most vital of South Africa's problems.

The premier said: "Constantly renewed attempts are being made by otherwise well-meaning individuals from overseas to interfere in native affairs in South Africa. There is no question in which South Africa so resents outside interference and the reason is obvious. The South African will not allow his country's future, his home, his happiness to be wrecked at the dictates of maudlin theorists 6,000 miles away. Such interference caused a great trek and nearly caused a revolt in Natal many years ago. Unless the irritating practice is dropped it may one day cost the British Empire the greater part of what is now included in the empire in South Africa.

"When questions of morality are concerned, European South Africa will not observe any other standard than its own conscience prompts, and it will follow no dictates but such as its own interests and reason prescribe."

House Decides To Make Change

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10. — The House today voted in favor of elevating guns on American battleships provided the President determines it would not violate the Washington arms treaty. The vote was 215 to 75.

Immediately afterward the House adopted an amendment to include \$49,000 in the deficiency bill, which it was considering to provide for elevation of the large guns on the battleships Oklahoma and Nevada. The vote was reached as the House was nearing a final vote on the appropriation bill itself, throwing big and little men into a colorful mating of wits.

FAVORITE HYMNS AND THEIR WRITERS

"SUNSET AND EVENING STAR"

Alfred Tennyson, the author of this hymn, was one of the most renowned of all poets. He was born at Somersby in Lincoln, England, on August 6th, 1809, four months before the famous statesman, William Ewart Gladstone and just three years previous to the novelist Charles Dickens. From earliest childhood, Tennyson showed a marked tendency to make verses and he and his brother Charles published a volume of poems in his eighteenth year. The following year he went to Cambridge University and soon gained the chancellor's prize for poetry. When he was twenty-one he published a collection of his poems with the title "Poems chiefly Lyric and Lyrical". The little volume attracted immediate attention; some of the critics were inclined to treat them as sickly and sentimental, but in the main they were well received. The people of England believed that a new star had arisen among them and in this they were right. Along with his great predecessor and fellow-countryman, William Shakespeare, Tennyson takes his place as among the greatest of all poets. Only comparatively little of Tennyson's poetry has been used as church music. Some verses of "In Memoriam" has found their way into church hymnals, such as the lines beginning: "Strong Son of God, immortal Love."

FLOCK TO ENGLAND FOR DOMESTIC SERVICE

LONDON, Dec. 16. — Between 3,000 and 4,000 alien women have been permitted to enter this country for domestic service during the last few years. The principal demand for foreigners is for good-class girls who can take the position of nursery governess and help the children to learn French while themselves improving their knowledge of English.

The reason why these girls come to England, apart from the money, is that they can carry on these jobs, continue their language study, and return abroad to better positions with a knowledge of English. French, Swiss, Dutch, Danish and Swedish girls were sought for chiefly, and it is stated that if the present restrictive order were removed hundreds could be placed where there are now only a few.
