"AROSTOOK" is discharging a cargo of 100 tons sorund Sydney coal for Mr. B. Cremer. PATROL BOAT "Hachelaga" was in port at Souris Thursday and sailed in the evening up the Straits. SCHOONER "ATHELONG" sailed for Georgetown on Saturday with 70 tons coal from Sydney for Matthew & McLean, Ltd. S. S.
