THE SITUATION IN ONTARIO.

It must not be forgotten that the Ro s Government has been so hard pressed that one of its leading newspaper organs some time ago hinted at a coalition as the best possible solution of the existing difficulty. Although in the two by-elections recently held the numerical strength of parties in the Legislature was not relatively changed, yet the capture of Sault Ste Marie by the Liberals hardly compensates for the loss of Muskoka. Local issues were raised at the Sault and by paying the employees of the suspended Clerique works the Government undoubtedly did a stroke of wholesale and scarcely indirect bribery. To pay thousands of men wages which they could not get from the company with whom they had been hired and which the Government was under neither legal nor moral obligation to pay was a corrupt act done under the guise of generosity.

In Muskoka the issues appear to have been provincial rather than local. Before the polling The Globe said that a Government defeat there would be "a Gamey victory" with all the evil consequences which such a victory would involve. Gamey took an active part in the contest and that which the Globe greatly feared has come to pass. The effect of the two by-elections taken together appears to have been to strengthen the Opposition confidence. From the first the Opposition have repulsed any advances toward a coalition, and they demand another appeal to the people, confident of securing a Conservative majority. The Government is unwilling to take this course, and is still keeping one seat vacant where the vacancy has existed for seventeen months already. There is no shadow of excuse for this violation of the law, and the moral effect of it must certainly be against the Government.

Thirty-two years is too long for one party to retain continuous power. It is greatly to the credit of the Liberal party in Ontario that for the first and greater half of the long term they gave the Province an excellent administration, but since the retirement of the late Sir Oliver Mowat there has been a sad declension. For years past the Government has not retained power on its merits but by resort to the worst devices of political malpractice. It is high time for a change. The cases are extremely rare where it is to the public interest for one party to remain in

control for more than ten years. The Conservative party had retained power too long at Ottawa when they went out in 1896. The Liberal party in their second term are far from living up to the standard which they set at the beginning of their term of power. All political history teaches the same lesson. One party may be neither better nor worse than the other but the tendency of a party long in power is always downward, and the political health of the country is promoted by a change of administration at no very wide intervals.

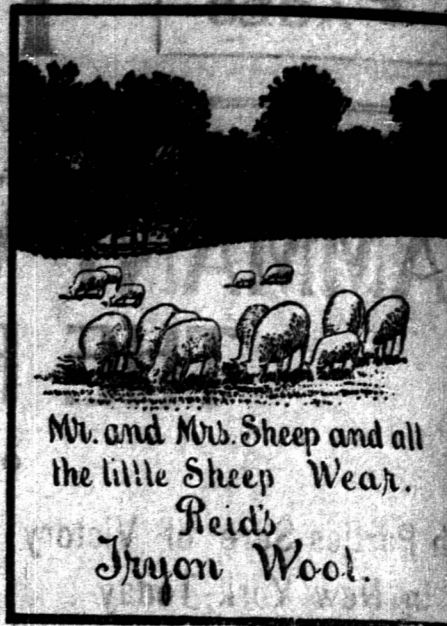
