Union Convention During the Session

OTTAWA, Dec. 10.—The question of calling a Unionist convention at Ottawa during the session is being seriously canvassed here. It is pointed out that since the formation of union there has really never been even a caucus at which anything but war problems were discussed and that no serious attempt has been made to secure a consensus of opinion among union supporters on the various economic problems and issues of the day. A convention called at Ottawa would go far to indicate public opinion as to the perpetuation of the union as the basis on which such perpetuation might be assured. Opposition supporters intend to hold a short informal convention during the session when representatives from various districts of the Dominion will gather here and mingle with the members.

U. S. Government Warns Germany and Austria

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10.—Notes were sent to Berlin and Vienna by the State Department today advising the German and Austrian governments that the United States desires a resolute no further communications from them which should properly be addressed to all the Allied nations.

To Abolish Compulsory Military Service

LONDON, Dec. 10.—An official statement issued by the government today says the coalition government is going to appeal to the peace conference with the intention of proposing the abolition of compulsory Military Service throughout Europe.

China Advances \$600,000 To Pay Peace Delegates

PEKIN, Dec. 10.—The International Bank has advanced \$600,000, for expenses of the Chinese peace delegation to Europe, though previously Japan offered to finance the mission up to \$1,000,000.

Maintaining Order in Northern Russia

OTTAWA, Dec. 10.—A cable from the overseas military authorities to the Director of Public Information says that Canadian contingents employed in northern Russia consist of three battalions. The first and their parties are engaged in training and leading the local forces raised in Archangel and in administrative duties. The second party forms part of the Allied expeditionary force operating from Archangel and including in addition to British and Canadian contingents American, French and Russian troops whose object is to protect the Russian people from the ravages of the Bolsheviks and to maintain the status of the Allies.

Peru and Chile Trading Again

LIMA, PERU, Dec. 10.—It is announced that the Peruvian government accepts the proffered mediation of the United States and Argentina in the settlement of the dispute with Chile. As a consequence the boycott against Chilean vessels has been ended. Chile has also accepted the offer.

CAPTAIN FREDERICK F. CULLEN
Among the sons of Prince Edward Island who have won distinction on sea and land few are more deserving of recognition than Captain Frederick F. Cullen who passed away on October 17th, as briefly reported in the Guardian at the time. The late Captain Cullen was born in Alexandria thirty-eight years ago, the youngest son of the late Mr. John Cullen, of that place. He followed the sea from boyhood and although blessed with but a primary school education he by perseverance and study climbed step by step until he secured a Master Mariner's certificate in the Nautical Academy at St. John's, Newfoundland some five years ago. He secured a position as captain with the Liberty Steamship Company of New York, and during the war was in command of the S. S. Wellington engaged in carrying provisions from New York to Mediterranean ports. He was chosen on three different occasions to lead a convoy of ships leaving New York for trans Atlantic ports. It was his custom when in the danger zone to remain continuously at his post and the consequent strain and anxiety no doubt contributed to his illness to which he later succumbed. On his last voyage from Europe in October last he called at St. John's, Newfoundland and while his ship was undergoing repairs he made a brief visit to his home. During his visit he was not feeling well and was advised by his physician and friends to take a rest. His duty called him however and he returned to St. John's to look after his ship. Shortly after his arrival in St. John his illness took a serious turn. He was taken to a hospital on October 17th and died the same evening attended by his pastor, Rev. Father Savin. His body was brought home for interment, the funeral taking place on October 24th, at St. Dunstan's Cathedral.

The pall bearers were Messrs. Emmis Corish, Cyrus Court, John D. McRae, John Beaton, Joseph Hayley and Austin Judson.

There are left to mourn his aged mother, two brothers, James at home and Thomas in New York and three sisters, Mrs. Place, Lynn, Mass. Mrs. O'Neill, Western Canada and Mrs. Jackman, Village Green, P. E. I., to all of whom the Guardian tenders sincere sympathy.
