U. S. Willing To Join World Wide Armament Truce

(Special to the Guardian)

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—The United States advised the League of Nations tonight that it is willing to join in a world wide truce on armament construction for a year beginning next Sunday.

On this point the nations are reported to be in agreement, as a sudden cessation of work in the naval shipyards would have serious effects upon employment.

The United States note was in reply to an invitation extended by the League late in September, urging the fifty-two nations which are to take part in the general disarmament conference at Geneva in February to join an immediate arms truce calculated to further the success of that event as well as to relieve the nations of a heavy financial load.

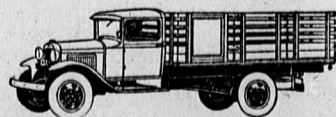

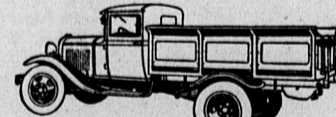

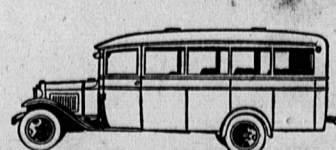
THE CANADIAN TRUCK
