Capt. McLeod and the Misses McLeod, Vancouver, who are spending a vacation in this province, returned to the city yesterday from Belfast where they had been for a couple of weeks.

Of a recent shipment this firm was forced to sell a number of cases at a discount owing to shortage. They and the shippers are made through the Canadian Express Company and they claim that the charges made are sufficiently high to not only carry the goods but for insurance as well.
