There are about 100 ranches mostly of blue foxes, and it is expected that this number will be increased to over 300 this fall. The industry was started there about twelve years ago. In December of this year Sweden will hold its first fox show. "But I won't say that it will be on a par with your wonderful showing here," the visitor added modestly.

SHELLAC IS SOLUBLE

Several things are to be borne in mind in connection with the use of a glycerine anti-freeze just as is the case with alcohol. One of these is that the solution will dissolve shellac. The latter, therefore, should not be used on hose connections. If it is, the supply of vital anti-freeze may be lost.

KEEP FUMERS FUMING

Fumers, primers, and other devices used for pre-heating gasoline in cold weather starting usually are quite efficient devices. It will pay, however, to see that they are working at the beginning of the season. Something may have gone amiss during the long period of inactivity for these units.

DRIVE FARTHER AHEAD

Driving "farther ahead" that is, being conscious of what is going on in front of one so far as it is possible, is one of the first features of safety at this season of the year. A greater degree of concentration is requisite, but the rewards fully justify it. The more time a driver has to execute any maneuver when streets are slippery, the better is his execution.

AN OUT-WORN PRACTICE

Some motor car owners still believe that slightly under-inflating the tires in order to get better traction is a good idea in winter driving. Tire makers, however, heartily disagree.

EASY STOP-LIGHT TEST

Stop-light signals should be at their best in winter. All signals should be for that matter and for reasons that are obvious. It is a good idea to test the stop signal daily. The simple way to do it, of course, is to step on the brake pedal and notice whether the ammeter registers discharge.
