JOTTINGS IN ATHLETICS

Percy Smallwood, champion middle distance runner of the world defeated Jules Hart and Don A. Braham, two Onondaga Indians, in a ten mile race at Forbes Field on Sept. 6th, in 53.08 1-2. Each of the Indians ran five miles, Smallwood beating both by a lap and a half.

Emilie Lunghi, the Italian champion at many distances, beat the world's record for the 700-yard run at Celtic park on 6th Sept. last. Lunghi's time was 1m. 27.2-5s. The best previous time recorded was that made by Leon Myers of New York on the old eight-lap track in Williamsburg in 1882.

Platt Adams of the N. Y. A. C. made a new world's record in the running hop step and jump, covering 32 feet 3 1/2 inches, beating Malcolm Ford's record of 31 feet 10 inches, which stood since 1884.

Shrub quit after running seven and one half miles in the twelve mile race with Marsh, at Winnipeg yesterday. The four thousand spectators were bitterly disappointed, but Alf said his leg hurt too much for him to get on. Marsh went the full distance in 60.16.

The 22nd annual championship sports of the M.P.A.A.A., which take place this afternoon on the Wanderers' grounds, Halifax, are bound to be interesting and successful. The list of entries is longer than in some years past and the best athletes of the province are among those who will compete in the events. Eleven athletes from this province will compete.

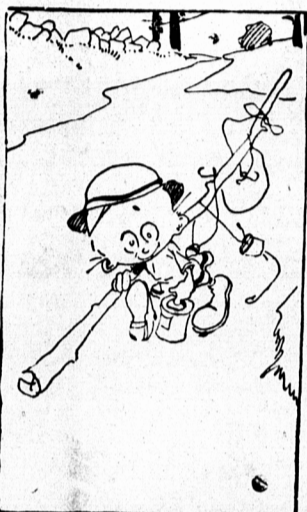

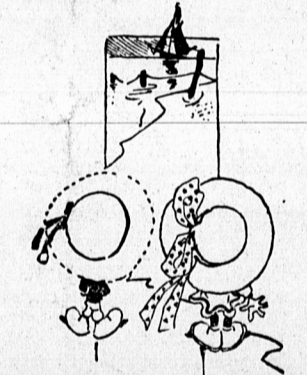
