CHARLOTTETOWN YACHT CLUB PLANS BIG PARADE AND RACE

During Visit of the Governor - General and Lady Byng Next Week. Great Display of Fireworks Will be Set off Under Direction of Firemen as Background for Moving Boats During Parade.

At a meeting of the Charlottetown Yacht Club held Tuesday evening, a request of the Celebration Committee for co-operation in the matter of a decorated boat parade and yacht race, during the visit of the Governor-General and Lady Byng came up for discussion and arrangements were made to have all boats in the harbor join in the parade and race, and the hearty assistance of all the members was assured.
The parade is to be ready to move off from the Club's float at 7 p. m., August 21st. Boats will be decorated with bunting and lanterns, and yachts and other boats not having motors will tie to a hawser towed by one of the larger motor boats. Judges have been appointed, who will award the prizes as follows:—1st, \$10; 2nd, \$5; 3rd, \$3. During the parade one of the greatest displays of fireworks ever known in the city will be set off, under the direction of the firemen, as a background for the moving boats.
All boat owners (whether said boats, motor boats, rowboats or canoes) who will take part in the parade are requested to hand in their names to Ivan Reddin, Geo. Buntain or Harold Barnes so that arrangements may be completed early for the order of the parade.
The prizes are worth while, and every boat in the harbor is expected to be on hand.
