From their experience with earthquakes and the man-made terror that is loosed from the sky, Fire invariably follows in the wake of both.

If a carpet or mat is frayed at the edges, bind it with carpet webbing sewn on with herringbone stitching. This is liable to tear away from the edge of the carpet.

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CARPETS AND HANGINGS

Even if your carpet is not noticeably dirty, it needs a shampoo now and again because grit cuts the material and shortens its life.

Make a lather of soapflakes and warm water and add a teaspoon of liquid ammonia to each quart of water. Go down on your hands and knees and scrub the carpet gently in sections, scrubbing harder where there are stains. Finish each section by wiping with a cloth wrung out in warm water, smoothing the pile in the right direction.

To remove fresh grease stains cover with blotting paper and press with a hot iron.

A sprinkling of bran brushed in with a clean, stiff nail brush will freshen a high-colored carpet. Re-

move the remains of the bran with a vacuum cleaner. A hot iron used over a damp cloth will successfully rout moths.

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
